Steve had a short fuse. Most people who knew him would agree that this was true. If something didn't go his way he would often over-react, think the worst of the

situation, be angry with those whom he thought were responsible, and then make judgements about the people involved in the "mess up".

Steve was having lunch one day with a close friend of his and was describing the most recent mess that he had to clean up. As he was telling the story, his friend Joe was seeing how aggravated Steve was getting. Joe said to him, "Why are you letting this stuff get to you like this? You're going to end up in the hospital one day if you're not careful. I know you're a perfectionist—and you have always been that way, but is this the way you want to live your life? Things don't always work out the way that you would want them to, and people often make mistakes, but our response to these kinds of situations sometimes adds to the confusion and puts everyone on edge and afraid to make a move. Why do you look at things so negatively all the time? And, in all honesty, do you want people, especially those closest to you—those you work with—to be afraid of you? How can you have meaningful relationships with others? And you know how all this anger can lead to sinful behavior. It might be good for you to ask God to give you the grace to change your perspective so that you can look at the day to day circumstances of life in a different way."

As Jesus begins his public ministry, he takes up the message that John the Baptist was proclaiming: "From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." The word *Repent* is key here. It means not only to forsake our old sinful ways...repentance means to *put on a new attitude* because you recognize the

presence of God before you. The difference between the message of John and the message of Jesus is that John's message was one of preparation and Jesus' message is one of *fulfillment*. We are now in the presence of the Messiah. The presence should have an effect in the way that we live our lives.

In this Gospel passage we also hear of the call of the first four Disciples. There was something in Jesus' voice and in his gaze that had a deep effect on them. The effect would eventually transform these men. And the same is supposed to happen with each of us. Being in the presence of the Lord should also have a profound effect on us. "Thus, just like the disciples, we are invited to cooperate in our own refashioning by taking the decisive first step that will put an end to our "old existence" and usher in a new era of grace and divine companionship."

Some of us, after many years of calling ourselves Christians or Catholics have still not taken the decisive step of acknowledging who Christ is in our life and begin the cooperation with the Lord that will bring us to newness. There's nothing worse, I think, that feeling trapped or stuck in our old ways and feeling guilt about our sins and weaknesses. So, when we repent we are not just asking to be forgiven, we are asking for newness of life—a freedom from fear and guilt or depression. We begin to have confidence and trust which leads to hope. In my view, a much better place to be!



Jan. 31: St. John Bosco (1815-1888)

John Bosco's theory of education could well be used in today's schools. It was a preventive system, rejecting corporal punishment and placing students in surroundings removed from the likelihood of committing sin. He advocated frequent reception of the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion. He combined catechetical training and fatherly guidance, seeking to unite the spiritual life with one's work, study and play.

Encouraged during his youth in Turin to become a priest so he could work with youth, John was ordained in 1841. His service to young people started when he met a poor orphan in Turin, and instructed him in preparation for receiving Holy Communion. He then gathered young apprentices

and taught them catechism. chaplain in a hospice for working girls, Don Bosco Oratory of St. Francis de Sales for boys. Several powerful patrons contributed money, enabling him to workshops for the boys, shoemaking and tailoring. institution had grown to 150 boys and had added a printing press for publi- gious and catechetical pamphlets. John's interest in vocational education justify him as patron of young apprentices and Catholic publishers.

John's preaching fame spread and by 1850 he had trained his own helpers because of difficulties in retaining young priests. In 1854, he and his followers informally banded together, inspired by Saint Francis de Sales.

With Pope Pius IX's encouragement, John gathered 17 men and founded the Salesians in 1859. Their activity concentrated on education and mission work. Later, he organized a group of Salesian Sisters to assist girls.



“The Beatitudes are some of Jesus’ most famous and beloved words. Yet we can brush them off in a pious but dismissive way. In piety, we revere them, but how often do we take them seriously, as if they truly applied to our lives today?”

As the Second Vatican Council proclaims, Jesus teaches us fully what it means to be human. Jesus is the answer to the question that is every human life. In truth, this is on display in the beatitudes, which foreshadow Jesus’ life and the truth of discipleship. In the words of St. John Paul II, the Beatitudes are “a self-portrait of Christ and ... are invitations to discipleship and communion” (Veritatis Splendor 16).”

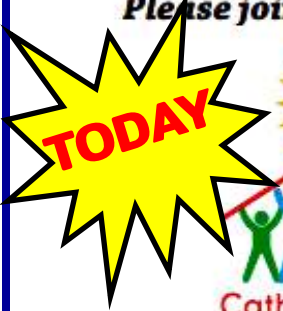

Feb. 2: The Presentation of the Lord

Mary and Joseph were faithful Jews who obeyed the Law of Moses. Jewish Law prescribed that two ritual acts needed to take place for a firstborn son. First, the mother of a newborn son was ritually unclean for seven days, and then she was to “spend thirty-three more days in a state of blood purity” (Leviticus 12). During these forty days she was not to “touch anything sacred nor enter the sanctuary till the days of her purification are fulfilled.” For this reason, today’s feast has at times been called the “Purification of Mary.”

Second, the father of the firstborn son was to “redeem” the child by making an offering to the priest of five shekels so that the priest would then present the child to the Lord (see Numbers 18:16). Recall that the firstborn male of all the Egyptians, animals and children, were killed during the tenth plague, but the firstborn males of the Israelites were spared. Thus, this offering made for the firstborn son in the Temple was a way of ritually redeeming him in commemoration of that plague. Since Jesus was presented in the Temple for this redemption, today’s feast is now referred to as the “Presentation in the Temple.”

“Candlemass” is also a traditional name given to today’s feast because as early as the fifth century, the custom of celebrating this feast with lighted candles developed. The lit candles symbolized Simeon’s prophecy that Jesus would be “a light for revelation to the Gentiles.” Lastly, this Feast has been referred to as the “Feast of the Holy Encounter” because God, in the Person of Jesus, encountered Simeon and Anna in the Temple.

Today’s feast is celebrated in our Church forty days after Christmas, marking the day that Mary and Joseph would have brought Jesus into the Temple. Though Mary was pure and free from sin from the moment of her conception, and though the Son of God did not need to be redeemed, Mary and Joseph fulfilled these ritual obligations.
