Information on Fasting & Abstinence

- ◆ All persons 14 years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and on Good Friday.
- ◆ All persons 18 years of age and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday.



As much as Jean tried to forgive her ex-husband for what he did to her, she just couldn't get there. The marriage was nothing like what Jean

expected it would be. During the engagement some things began to manifest themselves: the drinking too much at parties, the temper, the self-centeredness. But by this point Jean thought that she could help him to get beyond those things.

Sadly, after they were married, it actually got worse. When Jean found evidence that Joe had been cheating on her and lying about his whereabouts, she said to herself, "enough is enough".

The divorce, thankfully, was swift. But what really hurt Jean was that her husband gave her the impression that there had never been anything there — no love, ever. When Jean suggested that they separate for a while, Joe had just wanted to move towards divorce. It was as if Joe just couldn't wait to be free of her.

Now Joe is remarried. He did this as soon as he could, which also hurt Jean very much, and she started getting angry with herself, feeling like a fool, having wasting so much time, and being so hopeful and trusting towards a person who never really cared about her to begin with!

And now there was the resentment, along with the anger and the embarrassment of a divorce. These were the feelings that were filling her every waking moment. The only relief she got was when she was super busy at work. So that's what she did; worked long hours to forget the pain. But she noticed something was happening to her. She was becoming a cynical and mean

person herself. Her capacity to trust was gone and she couldn't help but think the worst of people's intentions. And because of this she pretty much kept to herself. Even her closest friends were having a hard time trying to reach her.

It's not always easy to forgive. So when someone like Jean hears Jesus' words, "go and be reconciled with your brother" or "settle with your opponent quickly" she's probably thinking: no way, or I'm not there yet — I may never get there.

Yet, despite very difficult situations, I think that Christ still gives good advice. Because if we don't find a way to let go of the feelings that eat away at us and start to change our personality, we find ourselves moving toward a kind of "death". So, when you are in a situation where it seems almost impossible to even think about forgiveness, put the "ball" in Jesus' court. Picture yourself actually placing all that hurt at the foot of the cross. Pray: Lord, now I see why you went to the cross — so that I might have a chance at letting go of all that brings me pain — of all that hurts me and makes me less than the person I am called to be.

This might not seem like a plan that will work. And it might take doing many times, but Christ hears and responds. Pain of this type takes time to ease up, so you do have to be patient. But giving in to all those feelings that we think will give us a sense of satisfaction, will slowly "kill" us emotionally and spiritually. So take Jesus' advice. It's not just one of those pious platitudes.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new





Try choosing one sinful habit to give up during Lent

Lent is a penitential season every year when many Catholics choose to give up some sort of tasty treat or licit pleasure for 40 days. It can range from candy to desserts to their favorite TV show. While these sacrifices are good and can help us grow in holiness, sometimes spiritual directors will encourage us to focus on one sin to work on. Sometimes it can be tempting to do it all and try to eliminate every single sinful habit in our lives.

However, that strategy is often unrealistic and we often fall short of our goal. This can lead to despair and a return to our sinful way of life, thinking to ourselves that we can never be holy.

It is possible that eating sweets is the sinful habit we need to root out of our lives, but if we look closer, it could be something even more mundane.

For example, we may be tempted each day to participate in gossip or to speak badly about others behind their backs. Many of us struggle even more with digital temptations, such as responding to every Tweet or Facebook post with a sarcastic comment. Whatever it may be, we all have our "pet" sins, and Lent presents the perfect opportunity to choose one to root out for the next 40 days. *Source: aleteia.org/2023/02/15/try-choosing-one-sinful-habit-to-give-up-during-lent/*

St. Joan of Arc, the Maid of Orléans, was born ~1412; she was a peasant girl who, believing that she was acting under divine guidance, led the French army in a momentous victory that repulsed an English attempt to conquer France during the Hundred Years' War. Joan was burned to death at 19 years old by the English and their French collaborators as a heretic.

In 1456, an inquisitorial court reinvestigated Joan's trial and overturned the verdict, declaring that it was tainted by deceit and procedural errors.

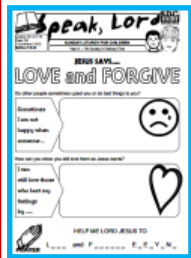

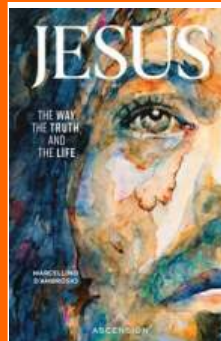

Feb. 21: St. Peter Damian

Born in Ravenna, Italy, in 1007, Peter Damian knew hardship as a child. He became a successful teacher, but only for a short time. He was ordained to the priesthood, and in 1035, he entered a Benedictine monastery. The monks lived in small hermitages, with two monks in each. Peter was known for his fasting, penance, and long hours of prayer. In 1043, he was elected abbot. Peter began reorganizing the rules of the order to return to the original spirit and purpose of the order. Men were drawn to the monastery, and Peter started five other foundations. In 1057, Peter was made cardinal and bishop of Ostia. Soon he was called upon by the Church to settle disputes, attend synods, and fight abuses. He devoted much energy to helping the clergy, as well as the leaders of the empire. With his letters, biographies, sermons, stories, and poems, he encouraged others to restore discipline to their lives. Through all his diplomatic missions, Peter Damian remained a monk at heart. He served the Church as he was asked, however, and as best he could. He died February 22, 1072, and in 1828, was declared a Doctor of the Church.
