As a man was standing in line at the bank, he overheard a commotion at the counter. A woman was quite distressed, exclaiming "Where

will I put my money! Where will I put my money? I have all my money and my mortgage here!!! What will happen to my mortgage?" She was all upset. Well, it turned out that she had misunderstood a small sign on the counter. The sign read; WE WILL BE CLOSED FOR GOOD FRIDAY. I guess Easter was not uppermost in her thoughts, because she thought that the bank was going to close "for good" that coming Friday.

A young man writes of his mother's death, "I was bewildered and lost. I missed my mother immensely. Everything she had touched became precious to me. Then one day my eyes fell on a card under the glass top of my dresser. I recalled seeing it there for the first time a few weeks earlier. But I had not bothered to read it. Now I pulled it out and read:

For every pain we must bear, for every burden, every care, there's a reason.

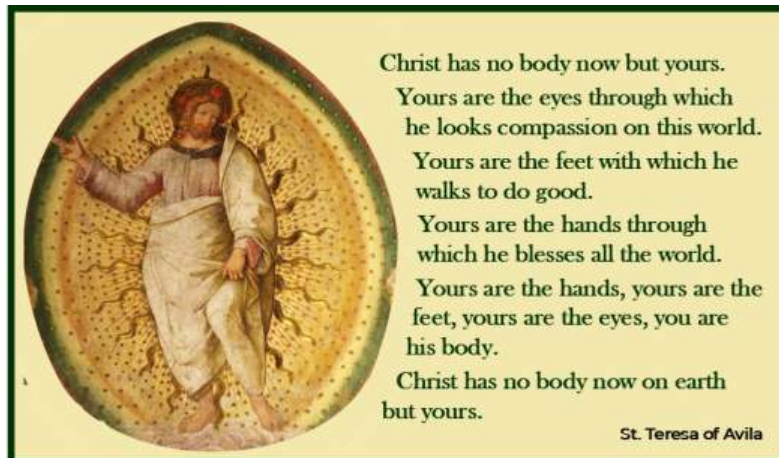
For every grief that bows the head, for every tear that is shed, there's a reason.

For every hurt, for every plight, for every lonely, pain racked night, there's a reason.

But if we trust God as we should, it will work out for our good. He knows the reason.

As I sat there, I could picture my mother coming into my room and slipping the card beneath the glass, as if to say: "It's all right, HE KNOWS THE REASON."

And what makes it all right is what we celebrate this day. Jesus Christ has risen from the dead and we are given a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit. Because of the cross and resurrection, our own suffering, our sense of being lost and bewildered (for whatever reason) can have new meaning and purpose. Death is not an end, but the beginning of new life. And death can be as real as it was for the young man in our story who lost his mom, or it can take on a different form, but still be a "death" just on a different level.

The resurrection accounts in the gospel all have slight variations (when we compare them with one another), but the one thing that is common to all of them is the powerful image of the empty tomb. That picture alone is worth a thousand words. No, Mary Magdalene, Peter and the others, Jesus' body has not been stolen, he has risen from the dead as he promised. It almost seems too good to be true, doesn't it? So, "why do you seek the living among the dead? He is not here but has been raised." There is no need to stand staring at the empty tomb.

Sometimes we stand at the "gravesides" of our own sorrows and losses, our own hurts, anger and resentment---our sins, and we ask ourselves: Why has this happened to me, or to the one I love; why did I choose the path the led to nowhere; how can I ever begin again?

The resurrected Christ stands before us and reminds us not to look for the living among the dead. He tells us not to be overwhelmed by our suffering---by our sins. The "grave" (in whatever form it takes in our life) may seem an end, but because of Christ and his victory over the cross, we have reason to hope. But we need to trust God. We need to see things from the vantage point of eternity. And we must remember, Jesus keeps his promises. It *will* work out for our good. He knows the reason.

There is a rather interesting epitaph on an old tombstone in England that goes like this:

Remember man, as you walk by

As you are now, so once was I.

As I am now, so you will be,

Remember this and follow me.

To which someone replied by scribbling on the tombstone:

To follow you I'll not consent,

Until I know which way you went.

The Easter message says we know which way

Jesus Christ went---and where we shall follow because of him.

Alleluia! Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, king of endless glory!

Did you know...

- ◆ St. John Neumann Parish was established in 1964. Our initial name was Blessed John Neumann Parish. Groundbreaking for our church was in 1966 and the first Mass in the new church was celebrated in 1967. The canonization of St. John Neumann in 1977 brought forth our current parish name.
- ◆ We have over 1,300 households in our parish and over 4,400 parishioners! Our parish continues to grow, attracting new parishioners each year.
- ◆ Few changes or updates have been made to the church since construction, but do include the stained glass, an expanded sacristy, the choir loft, and A/C.
- ◆ Ss Colman-John Neumann School (SCJN) opened in 1967 as Blessed John Neumann School, originally staffed by the Sisters of Saint Francis. In 1976, the school combined with Saint Colman, and with the canonization of St. John Neumann in 1977, the school became Ss. Colman-John Neumann School.
- ◆ SCJN enrollment has reached 385 students and over 200 families — our enrollment has been growing in recent years.
- ◆ The school has been expanded several times since its opening, most recently with the addition of a full-size gymnasium and additional classrooms when the Life Center was constructed in 2012.
- ◆ The Life Center has also supported the parish ministries and parish events in addition to the school.

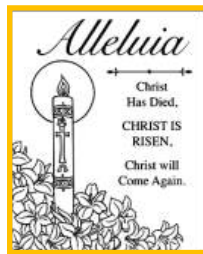

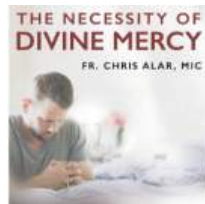

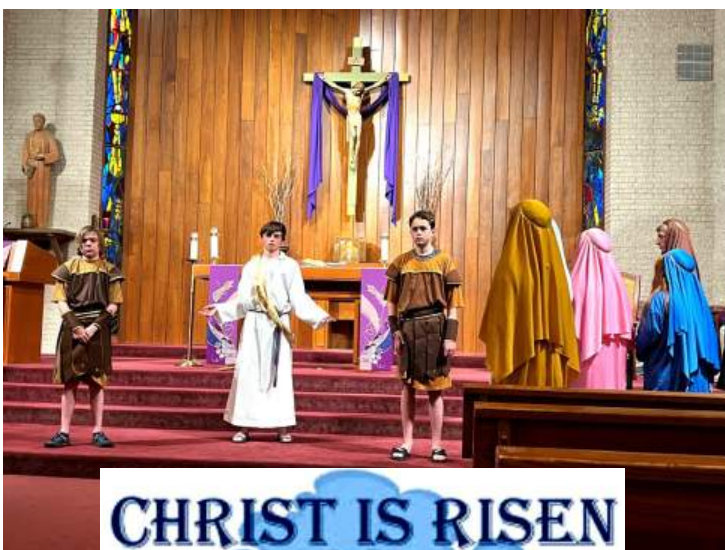
