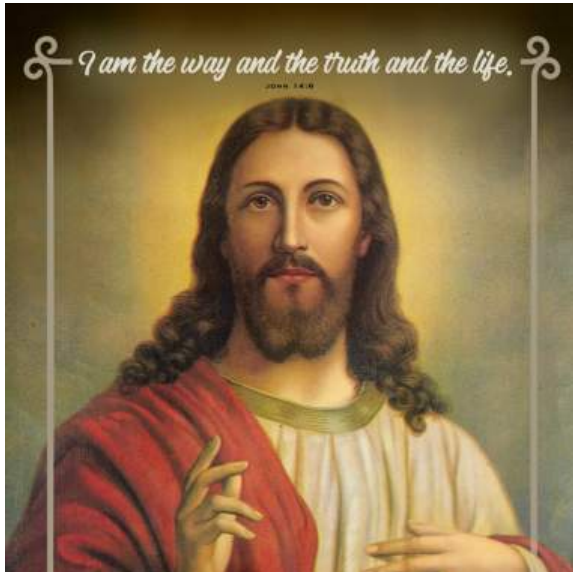

Paul felt like he was lost. He really couldn't figure out what God was up to in his life lately. So many of the things that he could count on seemed to be vanishing away.

And in the midst of all this he felt very alone. There weren't too many people who would understand what he was talking about, or where he was coming from.

Paul was in his mid 70's. He lost his wife, Sarah, six months ago, although it felt like it was just yesterday. He was still waking up in the morning with that sad, empty feeling somewhere in the pit of his stomach. His health was faltering too. Although he wanted more than anything to stay in the house where he and his wife raised their family, he saw with each passing week, that it was getting harder and harder.

Only one of his three children was living in the area, but his life was such a shambles, that he never seemed to have time for anything but himself and his problems. His usual response to things was: "I just can't deal with that right now!" Paul's other two children were insisting that he move into some type of assisted living facility. They said that they didn't want to have to be worrying about something happening to him alone in that house.

Paul liked to go to Mass on Sundays with his wife and three kids. And as a family they did that faithfully. But now, with his walking so shaky, he was afraid to try. And it would be too painful to go without Sarah. Sadly, he hadn't been to church since his wife died. Her funeral was the last time he was in that church. Some days he even felt as if even God had abandoned him.

One Sunday, the extraordinary minister of the Eucharist came to his house to bring him Holy Communion. As part of the short service, the Minister read the Gospel for the day. The first line really caught his attention: Do not let your heart be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me.

"How I wish I could believe this", he thought to himself. "How can I not be troubled when it seems that I'm loosing everything. I sure wish God would be more clear about what is happening in my life and why."

I would think that many of us have felt like poor old Paul. The circumstances may vary, but the feelings are the same. Probably Thomas' question is more suited to where we are coming from: "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" We would like a simple, clearly marked road to direct us through the often dark wood of our lives.

What is Jesus' reply to the question: *I am* the way, and the truth, and the life. In other words, look to me instead of "the plan". Stop letting your fears and your misunderstandings cloud your vision and make you angry. So, what we are offered is not a map but a *person*. In many ways I think it is better to start with Christ than with our emotions. Relying on person of Christ may seem risky business. A map or a plan seems so much more explicit. But how often does the map get blown up anyway. Better maybe to stop living with the fears we create out of our predictions for the future.

Take the *person* rather than the map. The person of Christ will teach us to trust. The person of Christ will teach us patience and perseverance. The person of Christ will show us His way. When both the way and the traveler with us is Jesus, we should journey with the greatest confidence.

May 10: St. Damien de Veuster (1840-1889)

When Joseph de Veuster was born in Tremelo, Belgium, in 1840, few people in Europe had any firsthand knowledge of leprosy, Hansen's disease. By the time he died at the age of 49, people all over the world knew about this disease because of him. They knew that human compassion could soften the ravages of this disease.

Forced to quit school at age 13 to work on the family farm, Joseph entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary six years later, taking the name of a fourth-century physician and martyr. When his brother Pamphile, a priest in the same congregation, fell ill and was unable to go to the Hawaiian Islands as assigned, Damien quickly volunteered in his place. In May 1864, two months after arriving in his new mission, Damien was ordained a priest in Honolulu and assigned to the island of Hawaii.

In 1873, he went to the Hawaiian government's leper colony on the island of Moloka'i, set up seven years earlier. Part of a team of four chaplains taking that assignment for three months each year, Damien soon volunteered to remain permanently, caring for the people's physical, medical, and spiritual needs. In time, he became their most effective advocate to obtain promised government support.

Soon the settlement had new houses and a new church, school and orphanage. Morale improved considerably. A few years later, he succeeded in getting the Franciscan Sisters of Syracuse, led by Mother Marianne Cope, to help staff this colony in Kalaupapa.

Damien contracted Hansen's disease and died of its complications. As requested, he was buried in Kalaupapa, but in 1936 the Belgian government succeeded in having his body moved to Belgium. Part of Damien's body was returned to his beloved Hawaiian brothers and sisters after his beatification in 1995. To aid our planning, these firms have shared initial concept sketches of the possible directions we might take. These are not final concepts but rather a means to help us envision possible solutions.

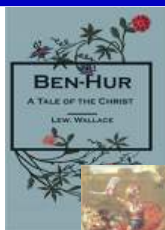
The Planning/Feasibility Study allows all parishioners to consider the proposed floor plans and concept sketches to consider options available to address our situation and needs.

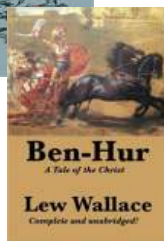
Book Club



Ben-Hur is a historical novel by Lewis Wallace, published in 1880. It has been widely translated and is one of the most popular books after the Bible — "the most influential Christian book of the nineteenth century". It was blessed by Pope Leo XIII, the first novel ever to receive such an honor.

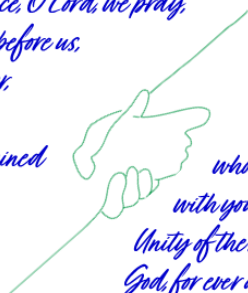

It depicts the oppressive Roman occupation of ancient Palestine and the origins of Christianity. Although Wallace was indifferent to religion before writing the book, he says in the preface to "The First Christmas," 1899, that the act of writing resulted in "a conviction amounting to absolute belief in God and the divinity of Christ."

A classic tale of betrayal, revenge, and redemption: When Judah Ben-Hur finds himself falsely accused of a crime, he loses his family and home. Surviving years as a galley slave, he manages to save the life of a rich Roman, who adopts him. Judah seeks revenge, but as his life parallels that of Jesus, he finds himself transformed.

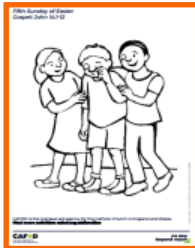

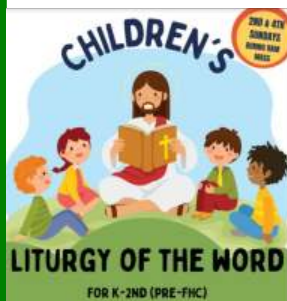

May 13: Our Lady of Fatima

On May 13, 1917, the Blessed Virgin appeared to three children near the village of Fatima, Portugal.

In the six apparitions that took place between May and October, Mary called herself "Our Lady of the Rosary" and urged Christians to practice penance, to pray the rosary daily, and to have devotion to her Immaculate Heart for the conversion of sinners.

The apparitions at Fatima were officially approved by the Bishop of Leira-Fatima in 1930.

On May 13, 2017, Pope Francis canonized two of the visionaries: Saint Jacinta and Saint Francisco Marto. The cause for the beatification of the third visionary, Sister Lucia Santos, is being actively promoted.
