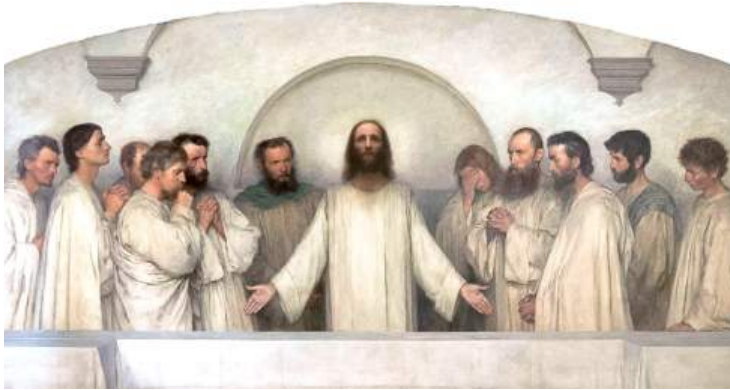

MAKE CONFESSION A ROUTINE!

TUESDAYS AT 6:00 PM - IN THE GATHERING ROOM



I'm thinking of a woman in her late fifties. Her mother, who lived in Florida, died just about a month ago. This woman is alone in life. Her husband died four years ago,

rather suddenly, from a massive stroke. In the years following her husband's untimely death, this woman gravitated toward her Mom. And now that her mother was gone she didn't know what she should do with her life. Should she move down to Florida where the rest of her family was, or stay here? In general, she wasn't sure what direction her life should take, and this sense of being in limbo was weighing on her. She was feeling depressed.

I would like to describe the situation this woman is in, and any situation like it, as *being between loss and promise*. The Apostles are in a similar kind of position. They are existing between Ascension and Pentecost. And they don't know what to do with themselves. They have experienced a loss, but things have not yet unfolded. The same with the person whose story I briefly described for you. Maybe you are in a similar situation.

When you find yourself in this kind of a "place", this limbo or in-between time (similar examples: after graduation and before starting new school; unemployed; experiencing a divorce; break up of a relationship or friendship; estrangement from family members) you may be asking: When will this end?

Although this time can be difficult, here's what the Scriptures tell us:

First you must pray even when the prayer you

make is "Lord, I can't pray anymore" or just "Help me, Lord". You must pray because it is a transition time in your life.

Second, you must look for the "value messages" in the stripping away. What do I mean by this? Well, every loss forces you into looking at things. People know that, especially (for example) those who visit hospitals. In hospitals I've heard more than one person say, "If I had to do it all over again, I would spend more time with my spouse. I would listen to my children more. We would spend more time together. I would appreciate each day in this world, and look at the flowers more", and so on.

When you're stripped away and you're faced with the essentials of life and death, there's a great grace there. So, in the "in-between times," you must sit back and look for the calming mystery of your new-found simplicity that will help you to re-align your values so you can be a good human being.

And, third, it's a "seedtime of hope". The word 'seed' is good for those of you who garden, and you can look every day and nothing's happening. But something is happening. Unknown, invisibly, something incredible is happening. Something you can watch with time-lapse photography. What's happening is that the seed is dying. But in the very process of dying, as it must die, the shoot comes forth. That's hope.

So, those of you who are in the "in-between time" or will be — and everybody will be — just be patient with the dying but have hope for the future. During this time, we do have reason to hope.

LITURGICAL ARCHITECTURE, RENOVATION INSIGHTS, AND YOUR VOICE!



ABOUT CHURCH DESIGN:

The body of the church is not simply a series of unrelated sections. Rather, each part contributes to the unity of space by proportion, size, and shape. While various rites are celebrated there, the sense of the nave as a unified whole should not be sacrificed to the need for flexibility.

THE SANCTUARY

This is the space where the altar and ambo stand, and “where the priest, deacon, and other ministers exercise their offices.” The special character of the sanctuary is emphasized and enhanced by the distinctiveness of its design and furnishings.



THE RESERVATION OF THE EUCHARIST



The *Code of Canon Law* directs that the Eucharist be reserved in a part of the church that is distinguished, conspicuous, beautifully decorated, and suitable for prayer.” It directs that the tabernacle be worthy of the Blessed Sacrament — beautifully designed and in harmony with the overall décor of the rest of the church.

THE ALTAR

At the Eucharist, the liturgical assembly celebrates the ritual sacrificial meal that recalls and makes present Christ’s life, death, and resurrection, proclaiming “the death of the Lord until he comes.”

The altar is “the center of thanksgiving that the Eucharist accomplishes” and the point around which the other rites are in some manner arrayed. Since the Church teaches that “the altar is Christ,” its composition should reflect the nobility, beauty, strength, and simplicity of the One it represents. It should be fixed and with a table or mensa made of natural stone, since it represents Christ Jesus, the Living Stone.

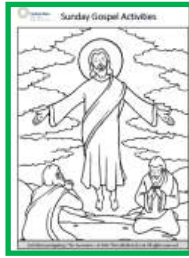

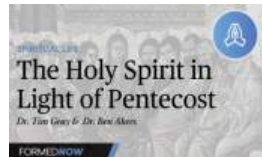

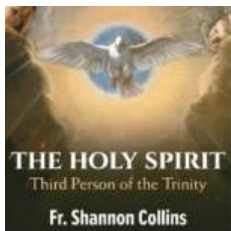

Book Club

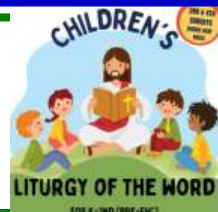

One of the most widely translated books and one of the most popular books after the Bible. Ben-Hur is a historical novel by Lewis Wallace, published in 1880 — "The most influential Christian book of the nineteenth century". It was blessed by Pope Leo XIII, the first novel ever to receive such an honor.

Although Wallace was indifferent to religion before writing the book, he says in the preface to "The First Christmas," 1899, that the act of writing resulted in "a conviction amounting to absolute belief in God and the divinity of Christ."

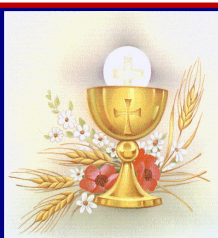
A classic tale of betrayal, revenge, and redemption: It depicts the oppressive Roman occupation of ancient Palestine and the origins of Christianity. When Judah Ben-Hur finds himself falsely accused of a crime, he loses his family and home. Surviving years as a galley slave, he manages to save the life of a rich Roman, who adopts him. Judah seeks revenge, but as his life parallels that of Jesus, he finds himself transformed.
