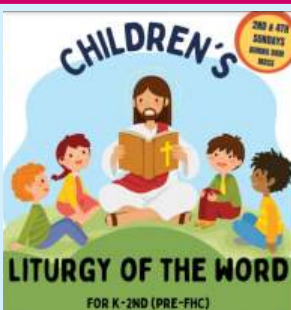

Bill had a son who fell away from the church a number of years ago. This had been a real hardship for him because he and his wife had blamed themselves for

what had happened. Recently, friends of Bill's, a married couple, were talking with him, and shared *their* sadness at the fact that their two children had stopped going to church. They were also blaming themselves. Bill said to them, "I know exactly what you are going through. It's hard not to blame yourself. I kept thinking about what I would do differently had I been given the chance. But here's what really helped me. One Sunday I heard a homily that made me look at my situation differently. The priest was trying to emphasize that we have to learn to place our concerns in God's hands and not think that it's all about what *we* are going to do. This changed my way of thinking, and now I don't pray, 'Lord, help me figure out what I did wrong' anymore. Now I pray, 'Lord, you love my son more than I do. I know you want my son to be *saved* even more than I do, so I expect you to do something about it. I'm going to rely on *you* to bring him back, and I believe I *can* rely on you.' And through the grace of God, I feel much more at peace with the situation. I don't preach to my son about going back to church anymore, although he knows how I feel. So, I would encourage both of you to pray in a similar way. You see, I had to learn to take the emphasis off of myself. I was making it all about my feelings of guilt. I had to come to the realization

that I didn't have the power to change things. *This is up to Christ.* So, I am still praying for my son's return to the faith, and I am confident that God will make it happen."

Jesus says: "This is how it is with the Kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how." Bill, in the story, had to realize that his job was to plant the seed, and that it was up to God to provide the fruit. All of us can name family members and close friends who have fallen away from the faith. So maybe "Bill's prayer" will help you too. But remember this: Don't tell God *when* to bring about the conversion, or *how* to bring about the conversion. Instead, ask God to give his grace to whomever he wants, in whatever way he wants! Say instead: Dear Lord, don't let all your terrible suffering and death go to waste. You did this to save us. I ask you, and I even *expect* you, our merciful God, to bring about the salvation of your people.

When you pray like this, God *will give* you the grace to trust him and rely on him to make things happen. Such bold sentiment expresses the deep confidence we should all have in God's loving care for our fallen away family members and friends.

You have no need to be anxious—even in the worst situations, because you have the all-powerful God working to bring about what you want—the return of the "Prodigal Son".

Book Club

Ben-Hur, Book Two: THE FINAL BACKGROUND IS PLACED FOR JUDAH BEN-HUR & JESUS

It is 21 years later at the beginning of the administration of Valerius Gratus, Roman procurator for Jerusalem. The author (Wallace) nods to the death of Herod the Great — thus we know that Mary, Joseph and Jesus have returned to Jerusalem: in Joseph's dream, he was told to flee to Egypt with Mary and Jesus until the death of Herod. Herod's sons are introduced — Antipas, Philip and Archelaus — who will also be mentioned in Scripture. Book 2 continues to introduce our protagonist, Ben-Hur, addressed by his given name, Judah. He is now 17 years old and we encounter him meeting up with his childhood friend, Messala (19 yo), a Roman. Times are changing, among the Jewish people and between the Jews and the Roman, friction is growing in several areas. Messala has returned from a 5-year stay and training in Rome. He has returned "a Roman": a Roman soldier with a solidly Roman outlook. Their interaction highlights their now differing views. For Messala, Rome first, friendship a distant second to Rome. Wallace notes the loss of reverence in the Roman culture — the loss of faith and the resulting ultimate demise of Rome (which will indeed come, but hundreds of years later). Messala's view: love is nothing, war everything. Down with the Greeks, up with Rome — this is expressed by referencing each culture's gods, "Down Eros, up Mars!" Messala wants to be the epitome of a soldier, and ultimately, a procurator for Rome: "The world is not all conquered." He sees Judah's views as dated and outmoded. They part no longer the friends they once were.

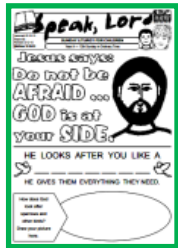
Judah visits his mother where we learn more about their life of status, their loving relationship, and the depth of their belief in God. We learn the time has come for Judah to let go of his boyhood and become a man. What shall he be in life? He seeks his mother's approval to be a soldier — not necessarily for noble reasons, rather for status. His world of status and comfort will soon end. They hear commotion in the street — the new procurator, Valerius Gratus is arriving. The Jews are jeering him. Judah leans out over the balcony to take a look. In doing so, a loose tile falls from above and knocks Valerius off his horse, nearly killing him. Judah is quickly arrested for this apparent intent to kill Valerius. But, in a lesson for all, the whole household is taken away, the house closed and sealed from entry.

We next encounter Judah walking as a prisoner with the Roman guards, worn and hardly able to walk. The country townsfolk seek information from Joseph, the carpenter. Joseph speaks with the guards. Soon his son, remaining unnamed, joins him. We are treated to a number of Scriptural allusions as Jesus meets Judah: the laying on of hands, the offering of [living] water from a well (Judah's thirst is satiated), Judah becoming as a child. Kindness without judgment. This leaves even the Roman guards affected: offering more kindness to Judah as they continue on. Judah "saw a face he never forgot." "And so, for the first time, Judah and the son of Mary met and parted."

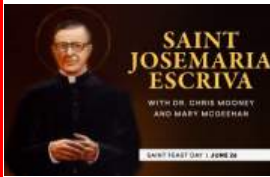

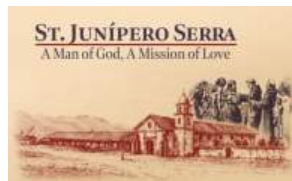

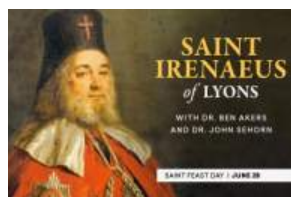

SOME MEDIEVAL PRAYER BOOKS CAME IN "DARK MODE"

The illuminated manuscripts of the medieval era are stunning. Their intricate designs, vivid colors, and utter singularity are unlike anything seen since. The Church's rich theology shines through the motifs and trailing margins as well as through the words of the prayers.

The medieval Burgundians, however, could show you prayer books that make everything else pale in comparison.

The Burgundians had developed a taste for somber, deep colors—colors associated with mourning in other countries—and they commissioned prayer books to reflect this preference. These prayer books were called "hours" because they usually contained the Divine Office, also "Black Hours" from the 15th century known as the Liturgy of the Hours.



The Burgundian "hours" were not the usual ivory color—in fact, they were black!

Only the Burgundians high up in the king's court could afford these books, because the dye for tinting velum was very expensive. This dye was heavily corrosive, so the velum pages had to be extra thick in order to survive the dying process.

In addition to the dye, only gold or silver paint could be used for lettering, since it contrasted well with the black page. Bright colors—such as aquamarine paint—for the exquisite miniature paintings were also costly.

Altogether, a prayer book in "dark mode" cost a fortune, but we can all agree with the medieval Burgundians that the effect is worth it. [Sign up for more daily Catholic tidbits: https://www.catholiccompany.com/getfed/](https://www.catholiccompany.com/getfed/)
