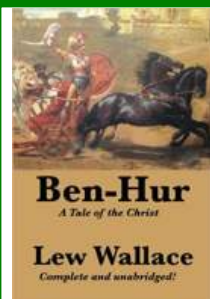

Bill couldn't feel more depressed. At least that's what he thought as he drove home from work. He had just been laid off. And it was all handled so coldly: "Can

you stop in tomorrow for a meeting?" "Sure I can." The next morning Bill goes into his supervisor's office and was asked to have a seat. And this is what he is told: "Sorry, we have to downsize because of the economic crisis and budgetary concerns, and your department is being combined with another department. Sadly, since you have the least seniority, we will have to let you go."

Now Bill was dreading having to tell his wife what took place. How would she react to the news? He and his wife Jean had three younger children, one in high school and the other two in elementary school. Jean had stopped working to stay home and be available for the kids. Would this mean that she would have to go back to work? And what about Bill? Would he be able to find another job quickly enough? All day long Bill could feel himself getting more and more frustrated and angry. Why was this happening to him and his family? Just when it seemed that he finally had things in place. It all seemed unfair! You just can't trust in anything. What was God up to in his life? How would he ever get through this? What good could possibly come from this?

Many of us have had curve balls thrown at us. We have experienced the uncertainty of having our life blown up in what seems to be an instant. And the natural tendency is to feel sorry for ourselves and stay focused on self. We can also allow these situations to make us become angry, frustrated and depressed.

Jesus says today that we should take up our cross and follow him. This is not necessarily the most comforting passage in the New Testament. But, what I would suggest is that these words really *can offer comfort and direction*. Another way to say it would be, "when you are in difficulty keep your focus on me and remember why I died on that cross. Don't get lost in yourself. Ask for the grace of perseverance to live a life pleasing in God's eyes; don't give in to despair.

Let me offer you something that I have found to be very

helpful. When you are confronted with life's challenging situations, do your best not to panic, or to give in to anger. Ask for the grace to look at the situation the right way—the way God wants you to see it. Even more important, *learn to ask the right questions*.

A person like the character in the story was asking the wrong question: "What am I getting out of this situation?" This kind of question puts the emphasis on self and pushes God out of the way. We think we are in this alone and that we have to solve our own problems.

So, here's the better question: What is God asking *of me* in this situation? Asking this kind of a question changes the focus and starts to get you to step outside yourself and start to look at life and events differently.

The more we do this, the more our perspective will change, and the more we can be open to the grace God wants to give us to start to see things the way the Lord wants us to see them. We begin to realize that what we see on the surface is often not full reality.

So, when you're discouraged, turn the focus off self and turn the focus to Christ. Try not to give in to the temptation to despair. Stop asking the wrong questions that can lead to more doubt and confusion.

Asking the right questions can help us move forward with a sense of hope and trust, knowing that God is truly interested in what happens in our life and wants to walk with us toward something much greater than what we see before us.

**Heavenly Father, you are trustworthy and all your words are true.  
You are the solid foundation, my rock upon whom I build my trust.  
You are steady and ever true, always present when I need You most.  
Grant me endurance for this and every day.**



**Open my eyes, Jesus, that I may see you in every moment.

Let this truth settle in my heart and give me unending peace  
amid the chaos of daily life and the anxious thoughts that spiral  
around my mind.**

If you have extra meals from your family dinners that you can send to Caring for Friends, it would be greatly appreciated.

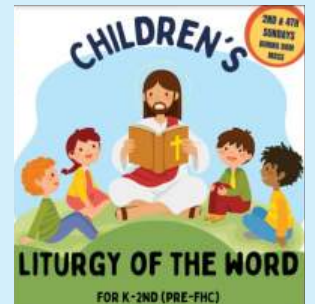

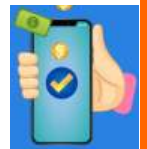

**Fourth of July evokes so many images: Fireworks, fife and drum corps, the Liberty Bell and ... old men in miters dressed in white.**

**Yes, the popes belong on that list.**

**\* On his 2015 visit to America, Pope Francis sounded like a Fourth of July speaker.**

Pope Francis stood proudly outside Independence Hall, where the Declaration of Independence was signed, and said: *"The Declaration of Independence stated that all men and women are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights, and that governments exist to protect and defend those rights."* He praised the "ringing words" that "have inspired peoples throughout the world to fight for freedom" and added that they "must constantly be reaffirmed, re-appropriated and defended."

**\* St. John Paul II often told Americans to rediscover and reapply our founding principles.**

Before leaving Baltimore in 1995 he warned that if democracy loses its moral foundation it would be "shaken to its foundations." But *"The United States possesses a safeguard, a great bulwark, against this happening,"* he said. *"I speak of your founding documents: the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution, the Bill of Rights."*

**What do the popes see in the Declaration? Three things in particular... The popes always praised the fundamental triad of: life, liberty & the pursuit of happiness.**

**On life —**

- \* St. John Paul loved to cite America's founding principles in the defense of life: *"I say to you again, America, in the light of your own tradition: love life, cherish life, defend life, from conception to natural death,"* he said at Baltimore.
- \* It's a message Mother Teresa echoed. At the National Catholic Prayer Breakfast in 1994 she said America must protect life. *"Then,"* she said, *"you will really be true to what the founders of this country stood for."*

**But the popes love liberty, too —**

- \* Pope Benedict also praised America's founding documents, always stressing that *"Freedom is not only a gift, but also a summons to personal responsibility."* That was the essence of his message: If we can't govern ourselves, we can't be trusted with democratic self-government.
- \* In a visit to the White House, Benedict cited his predecessor, saying *"in a world without truth, freedom loses its foundation, and a democracy without values can lose its very soul."* He also quoted George Washington saying that *"religion and morality represent 'indispensable supports' of political prosperity."*
- \* The right to liberty was a major focus of Pope Francis' visit to America, which came in the wake of major religious freedom challenges in America. At Independence Hall, he warned against reducing the religious liberty to the right to worship. *"Because religion itself, the religious dimension, is not a subculture; it is part of the culture of every people and every nation."*

**Popes even support the pursuit of happiness —**

- \* To the founders, "the pursuit of happiness" never meant "do whatever you like." Pope John Paul II described what it really means when he received U.S. Ambassador Lindy Boggs' credentials in 1997. *"The Founding Fathers of the United States asserted their claim to freedom and independence on the basis of certain 'self-evident' truths about the human person: truths which could be discerned in human nature, built into it by 'nature's God,'"* he said.
- \* He called America *"a great experiment in what George Washington called 'ordered liberty': an experiment in which men and women would enjoy equality of rights and opportunities in the pursuit of happiness."* He added that the founders *"clearly understood that there could be no true freedom without moral responsibility and accountability, and no happiness without respect"* for the human person.

**But those aren't the most Fourth of July things the popes have said —**

- \* *"Let us preserve freedom. Let us cherish freedom. Freedom of conscience, religious freedom, the freedom of each person, each family, each people,"* Pope Francis said, at the Liberty Bell. *"[I]t has been given to you by God himself."*
- \* And here's how John Paul left the United States in 1995: *"America: may your trust always be in God and in none other, and then, 'The star-spangled banner in triumph shall wave o'er the land of the free and the home of the brave.'"*
