Rachel was often her own worst enemy. All she wanted in her life was to be at peace, to stay calm. But it seemed that most of the time she would be lost in

worry about one thing or another. Often she would look at a situation and draw all the wrong conclusions, or gear herself for what she thought would be the “worst”. But usually what she spent so much time feeling anxious over would amount to nothing. One of her friends once jokingly said to her, “With an imagination like yours you should be writing scripts for movies!”

One thing that Rachel started to notice, though, and this realization was a grace from God, was that the level of worry and anxiety in her life was proportionate to the amount of time given to prayer. The more faithful she was to prayer, the more she’d be able to deal more positively with what came her way from one day to the next. When she started to allow herself to be distracted by things of the world, and stop praying, she would be more agitated and fearful.

I think that many of us feel like Rachel. Maybe we spend a lot of time anxious and fearful of what could happen. There’s a real sense of loneliness when we are overcome by our fears. We have this feeling that there’s no one to help us with our problems. A Trappist monk and Scripture scholar, Erasmo Leiva-Merikakis reminds us that we must “at last transfer our sphere of activity from *the interior of our own anxious spirit to the spacious heaven of God’s providence.*”

In other words, we must not allow ourselves to be trapped and held prisoner by our own fears and doubts. There’s an openness and a freedom to placing ourselves in the hands of God’s loving Providence. This writer goes on to say, “Anxiety is like a black sun that usurps the place trust should occupy in my soul.” Which is where our reading from Matthew’s Gospel comes in: “Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for my yoke is easy and my burden light.”

Coming to Jesus is the condition of finding relief. In Jesus’ words we hear the beautiful invitation to enter the sphere of his presence. When we do this, the pressures placed on us by the world and by ourselves begin to ease up. To the extent that we choose to keep distant from Christ, the more we can be manipulated by the Evil One, and our own passions. What we are reminded of is that Jesus, whose name means Savior, is the source of *relief from all oppression, whether self-generated or imposed on us from without.* God is not interested in us trying to impress Him with our own heroics and ability to handle things, but rather to simply allow Christ to live within us. “My yoke is easy and my burden light.”

### *July 22: St. Mary Magdalene*

Mary Magdalene was one of Christ’s disciples. She has been identified with several Marys in the Gospel: Mary, the sister of Martha and Lazarus; Mary, the sinner who washed Jesus’ feet with her tears; Mary, a woman who cared for Jesus and his apostles on their journey. Today scholars believe that Mary Magdalene was not the sinful woman in Scripture although she has been confused with this unnamed woman for centuries. Matthew, Mark, and John record that Mary of Magdala was present at the crucifixion of Jesus and that she was among the women who visited the tomb on Easter morning. Luke mentions her presence only at the tomb on Easter. According to John, Mary was specially privileged to see and speak to the risen Lord on Easter morning. She thought he was the gardener until he said her name.

So Mary Magdalene was near Jesus in his darkest hour and again in his most glorious hour. Moreover, she was an outstanding disciple of Jesus. Because Mary Magdalene was the one who brought the news of Jesus’ resurrection to the apostles, she is called the Apostle to the Apostles. For centuries St. Mary Magdalene has been considered a model of complete generosity and of sincere sorrow for sin.

## St. Charles Borromeo Seminary

As many of you probably know, the current Wynnewood campus of St. Charles Borromeo Seminary has been sold to Main Line Health. We have been renting the property to remain there for the moment. Many have asked how the move is going or when it will happen. The campus is being moved to the Gwynedd Mercy University campus (near North Wales and Lansdale), where the seminary purchased 15 acres of land as well as an existing dormitory building that is basically ready to move into. We are scheduled to leave our current location in late May 2024. Official groundbreaking began this past December and the foundation for our new construction has already begun. In terms of leaving our current campus, the Immaculate Conception Chapel on the upper side of St. Charles has been closed since Dec. 9<sup>th</sup>. The stained glass windows are being relocated from that chapel to our new Gwynedd chapel (to be built). As a member of the art committee, I can tell you that we've already begun the process of selecting artwork and statues to take with us. We've also started clearing things from the seminary that have accumulated during our over 150 years there. St. Martin's Chapel (the main chapel) will remain open and in use until St. Charles Day on Nov. 4<sup>th</sup> this year, after which it will also be closed to begin the process of clearing it out. While the seminarians and priests are sad to leave our historic campus, our rector, Fr. Chylinski, has done an excellent job of engendering hope and excitement for our new chapter.

**St. Apollinaris (July 20)** is believed to have been a disciple of Saint Peter. He was born in Antioch, Turkey and became the first bishop of Ravenna, Italy. He faced nearly constant persecution. He and his flock were exiled from Ravenna because of his preaching and ability to attract converts. When Emperor Vespasian banished Christians, Apollinaris was beaten by a mob and reputedly died soon after. He is a noted miracle worker. Centuries after his death he appeared in a vision to St. Romuald.

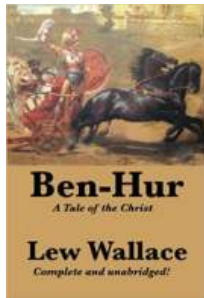

## Book Club

### Ben-Hur: Book 4, Part I



It is 5 years later, in the year 29. "There is an opinion that the extravagance and dissoluteness of the age had their origin in Rome." The corruption has extended to Greece and Egypt. Judah Ben-Hur is now a man, cultivated, refined, having reached manhood in Rome. He sees a ship approaching with distinctive yellow flags and learns that the owner of the vessels is a Hebrew, vastly rich and though he now lives in Antioch, he previously served a very ancient family in Jerusalem, by the name of *Hur*. This man is Simonides. Judah learns his story and sets out to meet the man who had served his father. Simonides has suffered extreme torture by the Roman procurator who punished Judah and the Hur family in an attempt by the procurator to seize the family fortune—that which was not found at the Hur house when it was sealed shut and all inhabitants removed. Judah wants to meet Simonides, not to claim his fortune or the vast property that Simonides has built — that would rightfully be his — but to learn what has happened to his mother and sister. He meets Simonides and also his lovely daughter, Esther (there seems to be an attraction between her and Judah). We learn the history and the extent of Simonides' love and loyalty to Judah's father (who is deceased, having drowned at sea). He has lived his life maintaining and building the family fortune, in hopes of returning it one day to the family. Simonides has vengeance in mind for the Romans who have tortured him to the point of becoming a lame cripple who cannot leave his chair. Simonides tests Judah, looking for proof of his heritage, which Judah cannot produce. Judah explains, to no avail, that he doesn't want the fortune, only his mother and sister. This has no effect and he leaves with a heavy heart that he may not learn what happened to them. Simonides asks his servant Malluch to follow Judah 'closer than a shadow' to verify Judah's story. He does so and they meet. Judah travels through the alluring "Grove of Daphne" which represents the excesses of living pleurably with no laws — but he is not drawn into it as others are. Soon, various chariots race by and driving one is none other than MESSALA! Judah Ben-Hur reflects... "It seemed scarce an hour ago that the strong hands had torn him from his mother... [and] a seal [put] upon the gates of his father's house." Vengeance lurks in his heart. Soon we learn that there is a prince from afar in town, who turns out to be Balthasar, one of the wise men. He is friends with Sheik Ilderim, also in town and owner of chariot with glorious horses but lacking an accomplished driver for the upcoming Roman races. The sheik is in need of a driver. Judah, having lived in Rome with a desire to be a gladiator (the sporting type, not the prisoner type), has become one of the most accomplished chariot racers in Rome (via his adoptive father, Quintas Arrius, who has died at sea). Judah sets out to meet the sheik, seeking to be the driver of his chariot which would put him in a contest with Messala. His goal? Humiliate Messala publicly. We learn that Sheik Ilderim also has vengeance against Rome in his heart. And also that a good many years ago, three men called at Ilderim's tent in the wilderness where the sheik concealed them from Herod for a year (the wise men!). Back then they had shared with the sheik that they had been sent by Herod to find the baby that was 'born to be king of the Jews,' and 'bringing the doom of Rome'. After a meeting with the sheik, Malluch secures Judah a trial of the sheik's chariot.

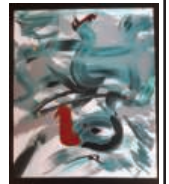
