



Mark was feeling very frustrated. As often as he said he wasn't going to spend hours using the Internet, he would always end up falling into the same traps.

And one of those traps was to go places on the Internet where he knew he shouldn't go. And usually after those long sessions, where he knew he was wasting time and not doing the things he was supposed to be doing, he would feel really bad about himself. Guilt would take him over and bring him down. He would then promise himself that he would never do that kind of thing again. But within a few days he was back and falling into the trap.

And now Mark was starting to think to himself, "what's the use", I can never conquer my problem. God must surely have given up on me!

Last week we celebrated the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. On the high mountain Jesus revealed to Peter, James and John who he really was: "his face shown like the sun and his clothes became white as light." The disciples became afraid at this manifestation. They were thinking how unworthy they were to be there before the glory of God's son.

And yet that glory is meant for all of us too. Christ has promised that we will be like him in heaven. How can a promise such as this ever be fulfilled when we look in the mirror at our weak and sinful selves? How distant from the fulfillment of such a promise do you think a guy like Mark must see himself! Yet, that promise is real. It was made to all of us at our baptism.

So, the question remains, how do we get "from here to there"? The only way is by allowing the Lord to transform us. When we are engaged in sin, we are not acting like the person we are called to be. And the only way that we can become that person is through the grace of God. It's never our achievement, it's God's grace working with in us. The decision we have to make is whether or not we are going to allow that grace into our heart or not. It's not about our conquering anything, but rather placing our sins at the

foot of the cross and saying, "Lord, I need your help. I can't do this myself."

You and I and Mark can be transformed into who we are really are supposed to be, but for most of us the process is slow—very slow, in fact. We may tire of the process and think we are getting nowhere. For persons of faith that's not the case. A person of faith knows that God's doing things for us that we are not even aware of.

When we are feeling overwhelmed by our weaknesses and sins, what's the best thing to do? Pray for God's grace, take advantage of the sacrament of Reconciliation, and allow God to do the rest. Not your plan to fix things, but rather God's.

And when we fall into sin again, as most likely we will, it's very important to NOT give in to despair. When we do that, we are allowing the evil spirit to succeed. Remember what the evil spirit's goal is: to shut us down; to keep us from responding to God's grace; make us think there's no hope.

There's a wonderful little book written by a French priest, Fr. Jaques Philipe. It's called Searching for and Maintaining Peace: A small treatise on Peace of Heart. As I close, let me share this passage. It has always been a help to me and might be a help to you, too:

...there flows a rule of conduct that is very important to keep in mind when we should happen to commit a fault. We certainly must feel sorry for having sinned, ask God for pardon, humbly beg Him to accord us the grace not to offend Him again in this way, and resolve to go to confession at an opportune moment.

Without making ourselves sad or discouraged, we should recover our peace as quickly as possible thanks to the graces from on high, and resume our normal spiritual life as if nothing had happened. The more quickly we recover our peace, the better it will be! We make much more progress in this way than by becoming irritated with ourselves.

And it is in ways like this that we allow Christ to transform us into the persons we were meant to be!

Book Club

Ben-Hur: Book 6, Part 2 and Book 7



Ben-Hur's mother and sister, Tirzah, survived their years in prison seclusion through the mother's total and complete faith in God. They are released from prison but cannot rejoin society as they are lepers, unclean. Meanwhile, Ben-Hur has finally reached Jerusalem; his heart is stirred for his recollections and the history of God, but noted that tax collectors had overtaken the Temple. He finds his old home boarded up. He prayed for the New King; sat on the ground and

slept from his journey. Amrah, the old servant at his house, had remained their secretly over the years, and Simonides, had secretly kept her supplied (Simonides had been the former servant to Ben-Hur's father, so would have had the connection to the Hur household). Soon his mother and sister arrive at the house for a look on their way out of town; they find the sign stating 'property of the Emperor,' and are devastated — they will not find Ben-Hur (they are not on the same side of the house) yet the mother continues to trust in God. As they walk, they encounter the sleeping Ben-Hur and realize who it is. But they must not touch him, they are unclean. The mother knows that Ben -Hur will seek to help them, if awakened, and thus may become infected too. In his dream he calls out to his mother... They leave and watch in hiding from across the street. Amrah returns and realizes it is Ben-Hur — she awakens him and they reunite; they speak of his mother and Tirzah — it is tearing at the two who are watching from their hiding spot. In the morning they are discovered and driven out of town. Amrah, overhears the story of the Hurs found in prison. Meanwhile, the mother and daughter take up residence in an empty tomb. Providentially, they seek water at the well at a similar time and Amrah figures out who they are. They establish a means of communication and provision of food. Meanwhile, trouble is brewing between the people and Pontius Pilate; the relationship is souring. An incident unfolds causing Ben-Hur to challenged a Roman centurion; he wins. And with it wins the support and trust of the multitude of men who are forming against the Romans. Soon, Ben-Hur has the men he needs to start training — to build an army to support the New King. They hear of a prophet in the wilderness, claiming one much greater than himself is coming. Iras, Bathasar's daughter, returns to the story as cunning as ever. Ben-Hur, however swoons over her. She is derisive of her father's faith in God and the child he worshipped years ago, thinking him the Savior of Souls. Ben-Hur learns that Balthasar's dreams have been invaded by the longawaited coming of the Savior. They discuss 'Savior' vs 'king'; the saving of souls. Ben-Hur is beginning to see that there may be a spiritual kingdom that is more important to men. Balthasar asks 'what is a limited life on earth in comparison to eternity with God?' He speaks of being ready for that call to eternity and the need to be prepared who would want to deny that glory due to their unfitness? He explains the challenge — not to limit looking for only what you're expecting. Meanwhile, Iras doubles-down on earthly things as the only things of importance. She seems to be calculating a way into his life to become his wife, to ultimately become as a queen — co-leading with him over the people and army she sees him building. Soon Ben-Hur finds himself encountering the herald of the New King from the desert — he is disappointed, the man doesn't appear as he would expect — an unwieldy beard, animal skins as clothes and is preaching. He sees another man approach and points to him. The other man is unique—peaceful, intelligent, and blending a look of love, pity and sorrow. He says: "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world." Balthasar falls to his knees exclaiming, "It is he, it is he!" Ben-Hur is confounded - is this a Messiah or king? Then he recognizes the man - it is the one who gave him water as he was taken, walking in chains, to the galley years ago! Meanwhile, Balthasar exclaims, "this is the SON OF GOD," and Ben-Hur is distracted as Iras calls for his help, Balthasar loses consciousness. As he regains consciousness, they discuss, 'Do you believe he is the Son of God?'
