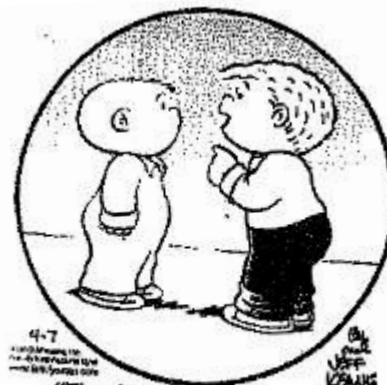

Why so many parables? They have been coming at us, it seems, week after week during this liturgical cycle of readings, and all from the Gospel of Matthew.

The common theme of all the parables really dramatize how God, through his Son Jesus, is always pursuing our rebellious hearts and asking us to turn back to him freely.

That's basically the point of the parable of the tenants as well. It's really an allegory of the concrete ways in which God has intervened in our history to save us, making us heirs of his Kingdom along with his Son, Jesus.

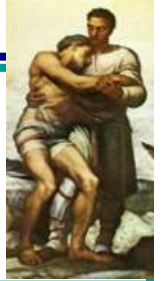
We see the patience and the innocence of the Master (who is really God, himself) who does not grow angry even though his efforts are rejected over and over again. Even the last attempt to send His Son—and we might even think: isn't this master a bit too naive?



But there is something else here to consider: Jesus knows, as he's telling this parable that he is speaking of himself and predicting his own death on the cross. But he is prepared to meet this fate in freedom and peace because he is confident in the promises of His Father that through this Crucifixion will come the New Life of the Resurrection.

So, what is the message that comes to us in the parable? God is trying to break through with each of us; to pursue *our rebellious hearts so that we may turn back to him freely.*

It is comforting for us to know that Jesus does not give up on us. In the end, what will win out over all these refusals of ours will be God's overwhelming love and mercy. Sin is conquered through Christ's death on the cross and we are saved. As St. Paul says in his Letter to the Romans: "But where sin increased, grace abounded all the more." We pray to be open to receive the grace that conquers sin!

Oct. 17: St. Ignatius of Antioch

Ignatius was a convert to Christianity. When he was named the second bishop of Antioch, Syria, Ignatius became a successor of Saint Peter. In 107, Emperor Trajan tried to force Christians to renounce their religion. Ignatius allowed soldiers to bind him in a rickety cart and lead him to Rome for martyrdom. As his cart rolled into towns, local bishops and Christians came to meet and encourage him. His friend Saint Polycarp, the bishop of Smyrna, received him with great honor, because he saw Ignatius's holiness.



On the journey, Ignatius wrote seven letters to the churches he left behind. The letters give insight into the growth of theology. Ignatius praised the love and support he experienced on his way to Rome. He insisted that the people obey their bishop and act only with his approval. "Wherever the bishop is, there let the people be, for there is the Catholic Church." (Letter to the Church at Smyrna 8.1-2) Ignatius wrote that Christ was present in the Church, in each member, and in the Blessed Sacrament. Of himself, he said, "I am the wheat of Christ, may I be ground by the teeth of beasts to become the immaculate bread of Christ." He asked his people to gather around the Eucharist and to care for "the widow, the orphan, the oppressed, as well as those in prison, the hungry and the thirsty." (Letter to the Church at Smyrna 6.2) He called himself "the bearer of God." Ignatius was devoured by wild beasts in the Roman amphitheater.

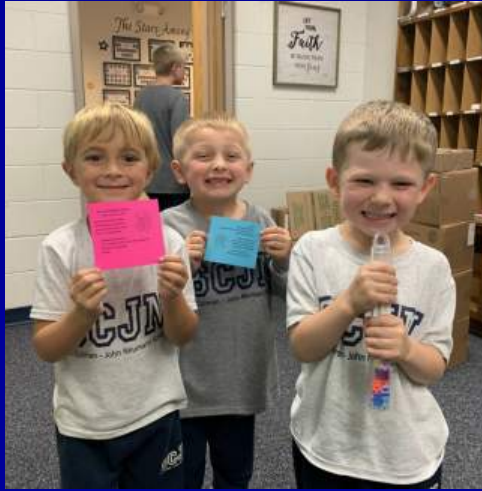

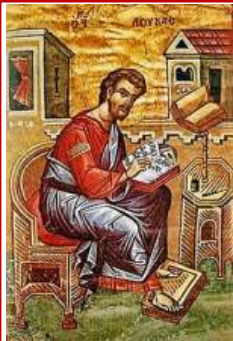

*The Secret Apartment:
Vet Stadium, A Surreal Memoir*

Imagine having the Eagles, the Phillies, or the Temple Owls playing just 60 feet from your front door for three years. Join Tom as he discusses his fascinating book about day-to-day living in Veterans Stadium.

"If I overheard anyone telling this story in a bar or at a party, I wouldn't believe it either. But I must confess, I'd probably "scooch" a little closer, eavesdropping, unable to walk away. I'd have to find out how this yarn unraveled. Let's begin an implausible story with a seemingly simple yet complex question. If you were single, never married with no children or dependents, would you, if you had the opportunity, have lived "on the down low" in a secret apartment in Veterans Stadium? In this proposal we have an off the wall South Philly version of 'The Phantom of the Opera,' but the larger notion this question begs could easily challenge the inner demons of sports fans anywhere. If you had an opportunity to live in a major sports stadium of a team you grew up loving, what would you have done? In my case: I could, so I did."



Oct. 19: St. Luke, Evangelist

Luke wrote one of the major portions of the New Testament, a two-volume work comprising the third Gospel and Acts of the Apostles. In the two books he shows the parallel between the life of Christ and that of the Church. He is the only Gentile Christian among the *Gospel* writers. Tradition holds him to be a native of Antioch, and Paul calls him "our beloved physician." His Gospel was probably written between 70 and 85 A.D.

Luke appears in Acts during Paul's second journey, remains at Philippi for several years until Paul returns from his third journey, accompanies Paul to Jerusalem, and remains near him when he is imprisoned in Caesarea. During these two years, Luke had time to seek information and interview persons who had known Jesus. He accompanied Paul on the dangerous journey to Rome where he was a faithful companion.

Luke's unique character may best be seen by the emphases of his Gospel, which has been given a number of subtitles:

- 1) The Gospel of Mercy; 2) The Gospel of Universal Salvation; 3) The Gospel of the Poor; 4) The Gospel of Absolute Renunciation; 5) The Gospel of Prayer and the Holy Spirit; 6) The Gospel of Joy

Luke wrote as a Gentile for Gentile Christians. His Gospel and Acts of the Apostles reveal his expertise in classic Greek style as well as his knowledge of Jewish sources. There is a warmth to Luke's writing that sets it apart from that of the other synoptic Gospels, and yet it beautifully complements those works. The treasure of the Scriptures is a true gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church.

The Tears of Saint Peter — by El Greco

Saint Peter's humanity really comes through in this painting. In this beautiful work, Saint Peter's eyes glisten with tears after he has denied Our Lord. Now deeply sorrowful and grieving for his sin, he lifts his eyes to heaven and seeks forgiveness.

In the background, to the left, there appear two small figures of hope: a woman, and an angel. Mary Magdalene represents the repentant sinner, and it is she who will tell Saint Peter that Jesus' tomb is empty. The angel is responsible for announcing the Resurrection of Jesus.
