Fasting & Abstinence

- ◆ **Abstinence:** All persons 14 years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
- ◆ **Fasting:** All persons 18 years of age and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
 - ◇ If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.



What is Lent & Why is it Celebrated?

Lent is the liturgical season of "preparation for the celebration of Easter. For the Lenten liturgy disposes both catechumens and the faithful to celebrate the paschal mystery: catechumens, through the several stages of Christian initiation; the faithful, through reminders of their own baptism and through penitential practices" — *General Instruction of the Roman Calendar*.

2024: Lent begins on Feb. 14 (Ash Wednesday) and ends on Mar. 28 (Holy Thursday) as the Mass of the Lord's Supper begins. Easter Sunday is March 31.



Each Lent, Catholic families across the country unite to put their faith into action through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Through CRS Rice Bowl, families learn about how our sisters and brothers across the globe overcome hardships like hunger and malnutrition, and how through Lenten alms, we have the power to make the world a better place for all.

A man sits by himself at the far end of the bar. He stares absently into his drink and hears these words coming from somewhere in the room:

*...and when the twilight steals
I know how the lady in the harbor feels.
When I want rain, I get sunny weather
I'm just as blue as the sky
Since love is gone, can't pull myself together
Guess I'll hang my tears out to dry
Friends ask me out, and I tell them I'm busy
Must get a new alibi
I stay home, and ask myself "Where is she?"
Guess I'll hang my tears out to dry*

And as he thinks about how lonely he has been since his wife died just a year ago, he figures that there couldn't be a better song to capture how he feels right now.

When he's with his friends and their spouses he tries to be pleasant, but inside he's crying, "Why me?" He's really lost. He's depressed.

Sounds a lot like Job, doesn't it? "Is not man's life on earth a drudgery?", "I have been assigned months of misery, and troubled nights have been allotted to me. If in bed I say, "When shall I arise?" then the night drags on". (When I want rain I get sunny weather; I know how the lady in the harbor feels, I stay at home, and ask myself, "Where is she?", etc).

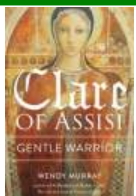
What did Job have to rely on in the end? His faith. And that's what we have to rely on too!



The Frank Sinatra song is melancholy as is the tone of this passage from the Book of Job. The question comes to us: How do we respond to the challenges of life? Do we "stare into a drink" or do we have another approach?

Do any of you know of a person who, despite having been beaten up by life somehow manages to still have a positive outlook? I've encountered people like this and I'm sure you have too. Don't you just admire them? Or maybe you think they're a little crazy!! I remember one person saying to me (a person who had been dealt a very tough hand in his life): "I listen to Jesus when he said to do "life" one day at a time, the future has enough suffering of its own. Live today. I didn't buy a ticket for this ship, but it's the only one I'm on. So, I'm taking the advice I give to others: make the most of what you have *today*. I have to tell you, without my faith in God, you'd find me hiding under my bed or worse. I know that God is real, that Christ will save me, and that *the future is in God's hands because that is where I put it.*"

In the end Job realizes that he has to rely on his faith alone. Sometimes that's the only thing that lasts!! So there's a choice to make. When the "black dog", as Churchill would say, gets the better of you, you can sit at the bar and stare into your drink thinking life is miserable. But there's also the option to look at life a different way and say: "Fear is useless, what is needed is trust...things will come out alright in the long run."

What is traditionally given up for Lent?

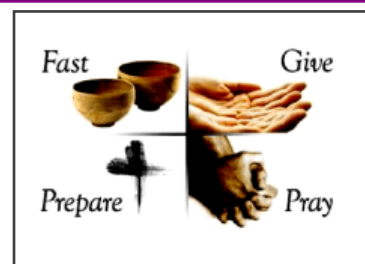
Since Lent is a time of penitence it is usual to offer a sacrifice to the Lord, both to appeal for the grace of personal conversion, and to strengthen our will to be able to cooperate with that grace. The two go together, since without God we can do nothing (John 15:5).

The best sacrifice we can make is to give up sinning. The liturgies of the first days of Lent make this point of the vanity of prayer and penitence without moral conversion. For the Catholic, daily examinations of conscience, more frequent Confession, as well as more frequent Mass and Holy Communion, are especially good ways to prepare for Easter. It would also be good to read Sacred Scripture, pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet and the Holy Rosary, daily, if possible, mediating on the texts or prayers.

It is also usual to make some material sacrifice, one that calls for will-power and self-denial, whether television or social media, foods or treats we particularly like, recreations and other pleasures that we crave in excess, and which keep us from prayer and good works. The extra time can then be spent to pray and to serve, whether to volunteer at one's parish, or a local charity, such as a ministry to the poor or a crisis pregnancy clinic.

St. Catherine of Genoa said, "Lenten fasts make me feel better, stronger, and more active than ever." Lent should help us to be more active, in Charity — in love of God, and our neighbor. That is the best preparation for the celebration of the greatest act of Love in history.

Teach me to reach out to you in all my needs, and help me to lead others to you by my example.

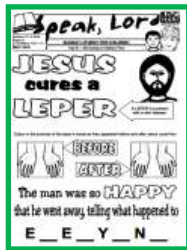

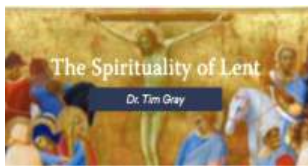

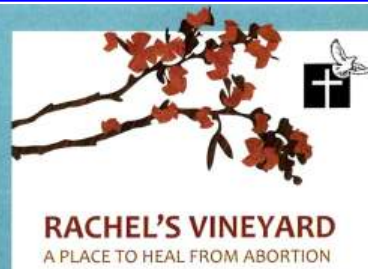
