DAUGHTER OF IAN AND MOIRA



A young woman was having a difficult time dealing with a particular situation in her life. As a result of what had happened to her, she felt as if she had lost a part of herself—

that part of her life was literally stolen from her and that she would never get it back. Her feelings of anger, hurt and sorrow were, on some days, very overwhelming. She also felt that she was slowly but surely losing her faith. She also felt that God was not happy with her for some of the poor decisions she had made in the midst of all that was going on.

One day she went to see a priest whom she trusted a great deal. They had been friends since childhood, both growing up on the same street, and she had followed his vocational journey through seminary to ordination and now as a parochial vicar in a large parish in the city.

She told Father Bill that she was having a particularly difficult day and needed his help. Bill knew what it was that happened in this young person's life, and this was not the first time that the two had spoken about the situation. Toward the end of their conversation Father Bill said to her, "Don't think that you are losing your faith because of what has happened. And don't think that God is displeased with you or has abandoned you because of what has happened. Actually, I just read something in a great spiritual book that I feel Jesus wants me to share with you now. Here's what Father Bill read to his longtime friend:

So, whatever happens in life, we must remember that God is in charge and if he permits something to happen, he can use it for good. Indeed, no matter what events unfold in the external circumstances of our lives, we should always have



confidence that God can bring some important good out of it on the inside of our soul.

To sum up, think of the crosses that come up in life as places to encounter Jesus. They're almost like "mini-tabernacles". We are used to bending our knees before the Real Presence of Jesus in the Sacred Hosts kept in the tabernacles of our churches. But, in an analogous way, do we bend the knees of our hearts before the trials that come our way? Do we seek to encounter God in those moments? For Jesus wants to meet us in those difficult situations that he has, in his providence, allowed us to experience.

He wants to meet us in the crosses in life, not just in the chapel.

"Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life...(and then) For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him."

So, don't give in to despair when bad things happen. Or don't think that you've "blown your chances with God" because of poor decisions that you've made in your life. More often than not God is trying to reach out to you in the midst of all the chaos. If you persevere with Jesus, he can actually bring something good out of what has been so challenging.

When troubles come, the temptation is to just look at our problems and be crushed by them, either getting discouraged or finding ourselves anxiously scrambling to solve them. But God wants to teach us something in every moment, even in our troubles. So the next time you experience a challenge in life, take a moment to look inside your soul. Ask God what he is wanting to point out to you through this trial and how he might be inviting you to grow. Don't miss the moment of grace.

Join in! Holy Thursday, 7:00 pm – Mass of the Lord's Supper

- **Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper at Mass.** Jesus celebrated the dinner as a Passover feast; he would fulfill his role as the victim of the Passover for all to be saved by his final sacrifice.
- **Jesus thus established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to his arrest and crucifixion.** During the Passover meal, Jesus broke bread and gave it to his Disciples, with these words, "This is my body, which will be given up for you." He then passed a cup of wine and said, "This is my blood..." It is believed the faithful who eat of Christ's Body and Blood shall have eternal life.
- **Holy Thursday also commemorates his institution of the priesthood.** He established a special priesthood for his disciples, which is distinct from the "priesthood of all believers."
- **Christ washed the feet of his Disciples,** who would become the first priests; this act represents the service and charity of Christ, who came "not to be served, but to serve."
- **During the meal, Jesus predicted his betrayal.** Following the Last Supper, the disciples went with Jesus to the Mount of Olives, where he would be betrayed by Judas.
- **On the night of Holy Thursday, Eucharistic Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament takes place where the faithful remain in the presence of the Eucharist just as the Disciples kept a vigil with Christ.**

Good Friday, 12:30 pm —Seven Last Words Service. Join in as we reflect on Jesus' last words, his final teachings.

He spoke to those around him, to complete strangers and to his family and friends. Jesus was speaking to us in his final hours. In his Seven Last Words, Jesus shows us how he has fulfilled his saving mission and sends us forth to follow in his footsteps. What are the 7 Last Words of Christ? Traditionally, these seven words (which are more like "sayings" that contain more than a single word) are known as messages of *Forgiveness, Salvation, Relationship, Abandonment, Distress, Triumph and Reunion.* <https://hallow.com/blog/7-last-words-of-christ/>

What Family Caregivers Need to Know about Dementia and Alzheimers

An estimated 6.7 MM Americans over age 65 are living with Alzheimer's dementia. About 1 in 9 people over age 65 have Alzheimer's dementia. Two-thirds of Americans over age 65 with Alzheimer's dementia are women. In 2022, more than 11 MM caregivers of people with Alzheimer's disease or other dementias provided an estimated 18 billion hours of unpaid care.

Brie Yousaltis, Director of Psychosocial Support for Abramson Senior Care, will explain the types and stages of dementia and Alzheimer's disease and what family caregivers should know to provide cognitively impaired loved ones with a safe, compassionate environment. Brie will also stress the importance of caregivers taking time for themselves to deal with the stress of caring for a loved one.

Brie has more than 15 years' experience as a geriatric Medical Social Worker and has worked in in palliative and hospice care.

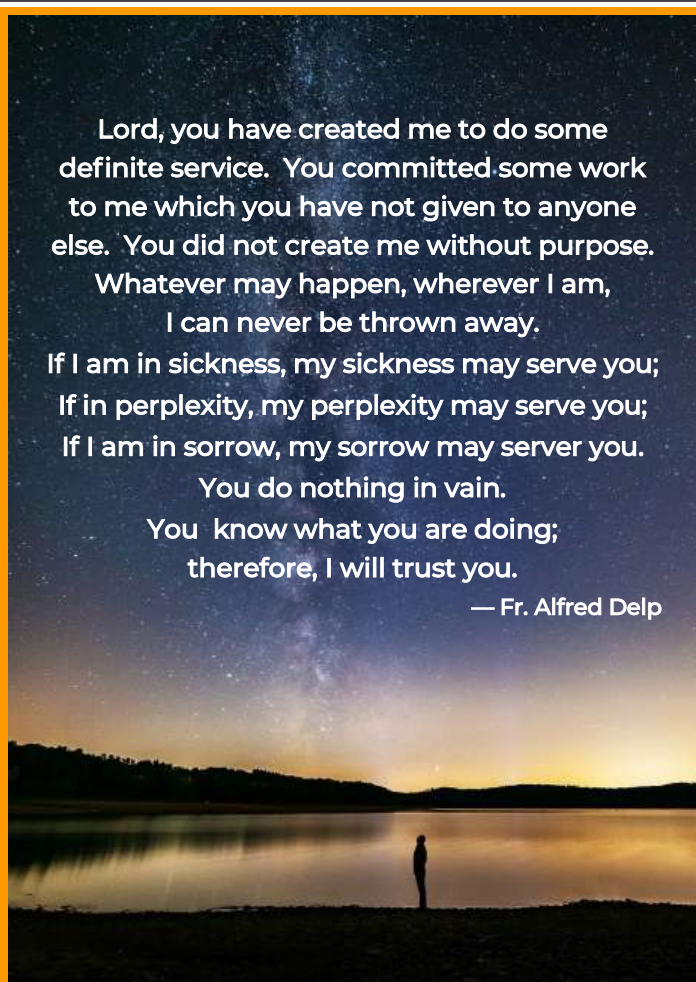

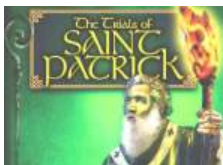

How the 5th Week of Lent focuses on Jesus' final year

The Fifth Week of Lent, also called Passion Week, focuses on the tension of Jesus' final year of ministry.

Throughout the first half of Lent, the Church covers a wide range of events that happened during Jesus' three years of public ministry. The Gospels do not put any dates to these events, but it becomes clear when Jesus is nearing his final year of earthly ministry.



During this final year of ministry, Satan began to move people toward plotting Jesus' death and at one point, there is even the threat to stone him (cf. John 10:31-42).

The Church has always chosen this Fifth Week of Lent to focus our attention on this final year, by going through such events in the Gospel passages selected for daily Mass.

If we are unable to attend daily Mass during these last days of Lent, it is advisable to read through the Gospels presented by the Church, which can be easily accessed on the [USCCB website](http://USCCB.org).

This was, in fact, the Pope's invitation in his Lenten message:

How does God speak to us? First, in the word of God, which the Church offers us in the liturgy. May that word not fall on deaf ears; if we cannot always attend Mass, let us study its daily biblical readings, even with the help of the internet.

St. Joseph, a Saint for Fathers (Feast Day: March 19)

Just as God the Father selected the Blessed Virgin Mary to be the mother of his son, he also chose St. Joseph to be Mary's chaste spouse and Jesus' foster father. As the head of the Holy Family — the model for all families — he is also the inspiration for and the protector of all fathers.

St. Luke's Gospel tells the story of Christ's infancy from Mary's perspective, while St. Matthew's Gospel gives us the story from St. Joseph's point of view.

He is introduced to us as a just man, a descendant of King David, a native of Bethlehem, a carpenter living in Nazareth and engaged to Mary. After the Annunciation, when Mary told Joseph she was pregnant, he resolved to break off the engagement privately. Under the law of Moses given in the book of Deuteronomy, if Joseph had made a public charge of infidelity against Mary, she would have been stoned to death. Before Joseph could do anything, however, God granted him his own annunciation. An angel of the Lord visited Joseph in a dream, urging him to take Mary as his wife, assuring him that the child she carried had been conceived by the Holy Spirit.

Joseph must have died before Christ began his public ministry. If he were still alive, he would have stood with Mary at the foot of the cross and there would have been no need for Jesus to entrust his mother to St. John.

It was fear of heresy that delayed devotion to St. Joseph for nearly 1,400 years. So many heretical splinter groups had denied the divinity of Christ that Church authorities felt it was more important to emphasize the doctrine that God was Christ's father than to venerate the man whom God had chosen to be the guardian of Jesus and Mary. Although there are isolated examples of Joseph receiving some recognition during the Middle Ages in Egypt, in England and in Germany, the Church did not grant him official recognition until 1479 when Pope Sixtus IV established March 19 as the feast of St. Joseph. From that point, devotion to St. Joseph increased dramatically. The Franciscans, the Carmelites and the Jesuits all promoted St. Joseph. St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582), who was particularly attached to him, said of St. Joseph in her autobiography, "With other saints it seems the Lord has given them grace to be of help in one need, whereas with this glorious saint, I have experience that he helps in all our needs."
