There are many of us who have wounds from the past that continue to affect us in the present. Sometimes the Lord, in his desire to come close to us, touches those

wounds—those parts of our lives that are particularly painful and are still affecting us. These wounds, if not treated, can fester, become infected, and cause deep, long-term problems in our soul—in our ability to love and receive love, to trust others, to enter into deep friendships, to build a strong marriage, to build a strong family life, and most of all, to live our relationship with God. And we can have received these spiritual wounds for many different reasons.

In John's Gospel Jesus says: "But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour." What is Jesus speaking about? He is speaking about his death on the cross. And what is the purpose of Jesus going to the cross? To heal us. *Jesus wants to fill our wounds with his love.* There in the valley of darkness, Christ's light can still shine, and you can be healed, your suffering can be redeemed, and God can bring some good even out of the evil you experienced.

I share all of this with you because we are about to embark on the most sacred time of the year. This week begins Holy Week. This season of the year we are invited on a special journey with Christ. And perhaps part of that journey is to travel with the Lord on a path towards healing some of those wounds from the past that are still affecting us — a healing of our brokenness.

So if you start to notice that you're a little more sensitive than others in certain areas, that you have certain insecurities, anxieties, unhealthy emotional responses, a need to impress, a fear of conflict,

a desire to control every detail, a desire to be esteemed by people on screens who don't really know you, an over-achiever side that's compensating for a lack of unconditional love in your life—this may be God making you aware of something that is broken in you, *putting his finger on something that he wants to heal.*

And the question is will we allow the Lord to heal us? Or will we continue to allow these things to weigh us down—to burden us? Maybe Jesus is asking us to change our perspective, to change our attitude about what it is that is troubling us. In our faith formation sessions this Lent, we have heard from one of my favorite spiritual thinkers, Father Jacques Philippe. He writes: "We are not always masters of the unfolding of our lives, *but we can always be masters of the meaning we give them.* Our freedom can transform any event in our lives into an expression of love, abandonment, trust, hope, and offering. The most important and most fruitful acts of our freedom are not those by which we transform the outside world as those by which

we change our inner attitude in light of the faith that God can bring good out of everything without exception."

Remember what Saint Paul says: "In everything God works for good with those who love him." The key word is 'everything'. *Saint Paul doesn't try to clarify by saying, "in some cases".* God works

for good with those who love him.

So, as we begin this most sacred time of the year, say a prayer that you will be able, with Jesus' grace, to name your wounds, and entrust them to the Father. To be able to do this connects you to why Jesus went to the cross. "But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour."

Easter Vigil In the Holy Night — 7:30 PM, Mar. 30th

The Easter Vigil Mass is the first celebration of Jesus Christ's Resurrection from the dead. It is the greatest and most holy of all solemnities in the Catholic Church; it begins at sunset.

The character of this Mass is unique: On this holy night, the Church keeps watch, celebrating the Resurrection of Christ in the sacraments and awaiting his return in glory. It is the turning point of the Sacred Paschal Triduum, the Passover of the new covenant, which marks Christ's passage from death to life. There are four parts:

- ◆ **Liturgy of Light:** we bless the Easter fire, prepare the Paschal candle and with it chant the beautiful Easter Proclamation, the Exsultet. We proclaim that Christ is the Light.
- ◆ **Liturgy of the Word** is when we hear important moments in salvation history through Old Testament readings; each is followed by a special prayer. Then there is a New Testament reading, another Psalm and the Gospel.
- ◆ **Baptismal Liturgy** is when new Christians enter the Church through Baptism, previously baptized Christians are received into full communion with the Church, and the baptized renew their baptismal vows.
- ◆ **Liturgy of the Eucharist** is enhanced, it is "on this night above all [we] laud [God] yet more gloriously, overcome with Paschal joy [at] celebrating the most sacred night of the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ in the flesh."



Join in! Holy Thursday, 7:00 pm – Mass of the Lord's Supper

- **Holy Thursday is the commemoration of the Last Supper at Mass.** Jesus celebrated the dinner as a Passover feast; he would fulfill his role as the victim of the Passover for all to be saved by his final sacrifice.
- **Jesus thus established the sacrament of Holy Communion prior to his arrest and crucifixion.** During the Passover meal, Jesus broke bread and gave it to his Disciples, with these words, "This is my body, which will be given up for you." He then passed a cup of wine and said, "This is my blood..." It is believed the faithful who eat of Christ's Body and Blood shall have eternal life.
- **Holy Thursday also commemorates his institution of the priesthood.** He established a special priesthood for his disciples, which is distinct from the "priesthood of all believers."
- **Christ washed the feet of his Disciples,** who would become the first priests; this act represents the service and charity of Christ, who came "not to be served, but to serve."
- **During the meal, Jesus predicted his betrayal.** Following the Last Supper, the disciples went with Jesus to the Mount of Olives, where he would be betrayed by Judas.
- **On the night of Holy Thursday, Eucharistic Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament takes place where the faithful remain in the presence of the Eucharist just as the Disciples kept a vigil with Christ.**

GOOD FRIDAY, 12:30 PM —SEVEN LAST WORDS SERVICE Join in as we reflect on Jesus' last words, his final teachings.

He hung there. On the cross, tortured. Dying. The hard metal of the nails fastening his legs and feet in place. As he struggled for air and was barely able to breathe, Jesus didn't hang in silence.

He spoke to those around him, to complete strangers and to his family and friends.

Jesus was speaking to us in his final hours. In his Seven Last Words, Jesus shows us how he has fulfilled his saving mission and sends us forth to follow in his footsteps. A prayer pamphlet will be available for participation and meditation. Join this service to dig deeper into the meaning of these words:

- ◆ *Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do.*
- ◆ *Today you shall be with me in paradise.*
- ◆ *Woman, behold your son... Behold your mother*
- ◆ *My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?*
- ◆ *I thirst.*
- ◆ *It is finished.*
- ◆ *Father, into your hands I commend my spirit.*

GOOD FRIDAY, 3:00 PM — CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S PASSION, THE ANNIVERSARY OF THE CRUCIFIXION OF CHRIST

- ◆ The most sacred hours during Good Friday are from noon to 3:00, when Jesus was on the cross.
- ◆ The tradition of the Veneration of the Cross dates back to the fourth-century. On Good Friday, Christians in Jerusalem would gather before a relic of the true cross to kneel, bow, and kiss the cross in remembrance of the Passion of Christ and to show reverence to the instrument that was used to crucify Jesus. We are also reminded that it is through the Cross that Resurrection comes.
- ◆ We honor what Christ has done for us and are reminded to embrace the crosses in our own lives. This moving practice inspires prayer and meditation. On Good Friday, we will partake in the reading of the Passion and Veneration of the Cross; Veneration of the Cross will be available until 6 pm.

What Family Caregivers Need to Know about Dementia and Alzheimers

Thursday, April 18,

An estimated 6.7 MM Americans over age 65 are living with Alzheimer's dementia. About 1 in 9 people over age 65 have Alzheimer's dementia. Two-thirds of Americans over age 65 with Alzheimer's dementia are women. In 2022, more than 11 MM caregivers of people with Alzheimer's disease or other dementias provided an estimated 18 billion hours of unpaid care.

Brie Yousaltis, Director of Psychosocial Support for Abramson Senior Care, will explain the types and stages of dementia and Alzheimer's disease and what family caregivers should know to provide cognitively impaired loved ones with a safe, compassionate environment. Brie will also stress the importance of caregivers taking time for themselves to deal with the stress of caring for a loved one.

Brie has more than 15 years' experience as a geriatric Medical Social Worker and has worked in in palliative and hospice care.
