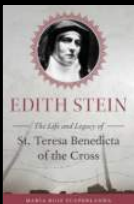

I would like to share with you one of my favorite scenes from Robert Bolt's play *A Man for All Seasons*. King Henry VIII is trying to coax his subject, Sir Thomas More, to

agree to his divorce of Catherine. They are in the garden as Henry is speaking: "You must consider, Thomas, that I stand in peril of my soul. It was no marriage; she was my brother's widow. 'Thou shalt not uncover the nakedness of thy brother's wife', Leviticus, chapter eighteen, verse sixteen."

More replies: "Yes, Your Grace. But Deuteronomy..."

Henry interrupts angrily: "Deuteronomy's ambiguous!"

More replies quietly: "Your Grace, I'm not fit to meddle in these matters — to me it seems a matter for the Holy See..."

Once more Henry interrupts: "Thomas, Thomas, does a man need a pope to tell him when he's sinned? It was a sin, Thomas: I admit it, I repent. And God has punished me; I have no son... Son after son she has borne me, Thomas, all dead at birth or dead within the month. I never saw the hand of God so clear in anything... I have a daughter, she's a good child, a well-set child. But I have no son. It is my bounded duty to put away the Queen and all the popes back to St Peter shall not come between me and my duty! How is it that you cannot see? Every one else does."

More answers: "Then why does Your Grace need my poor support?"

And Henry comes back with those powerful words that everyone of us would like to hear: "Because you are honest. What's more to the purpose, you're known to be honest... There are those like Norfolk who follow me because I wear the crown, and there are those like Master Cromwell who follow me because they are jackals with sharp teeth and I am their lion, and there is a mass that follows me because it follows anything that moves—*and there is you.*"

Henry, in the presence of More's integrity, knew who was really king and who was really the subject.

On this great feast of Christ the King, we hear from John's gospel. It is the trial before Pilate. Yet there is irony here. The powerless prisoner is the king while the powerful ruler is the subject. Pilate is really the one on trial, and he is faced with a decision that he does not like or want to make. He pretends to be confused or conflicted. In the midst of the pressure to decide against Jesus and in favor of the crowd Pilate all of a sudden turns philosophical and asks a question more suited to the classroom than the courtroom: "What is truth?" It's really a smoke screen. Jesus knows it but uses the situation to teach something about the nature of his kingdom. Pilate is really trying to find a way out of making a decision that would hurt him. Inside himself he knows the Jews will report him to his boss, the

emperor of Rome, for not doing away with false claimants to the throne. He prefers his job to his integrity and decides against Jesus. Pilate condemns himself by being afraid. Thomas More is in a similar kind of situation, but chooses a different path, for we know that More gave his life rather than turn against his faith.

And I think there's something in these two scenes played out for us that sheds a light on our own times and struggles.

Throughout our land many are losing faith in their institutions. And when people lose faith in their institutions, this means that the present culture is eroding but the emerging one is yet to be seen.

The future is murky, and many do not believe that our leadership or the people are up to the task. There is uncertainty in the air, and it seems that no prophet can be found. There is a belief that greed, promiscuity, and violence are evident everywhere. There is within the nation a growing number of people who reject belief in God. They suffer from illusions of self-autonomy. Many traditional values have not only been challenged, but it seems that there are forces afoot to destroy them. Some say that the best we will face is a mixture of good and dark times. But the challenge of those dark times will require our response.

I'm not speaking of political issues or political parties, but rather, of cultural issues—social issues. There is a subtle but obvious attack on the faith. Our religion is called a myth and self-sufficiency is the new value of our times. It is not only the church as institution that is being dismissed, but the very idea that any of us need to be saved at all! "Saved from what?", is the question asked. "No one needs a savior. I'm a good person."

Despite what we hear in John's gospel, it's as if Christ *were* being put on trial and the secular world wants to see him dead. Others have thought of this before. Christ stood before Pilate, and presently Christ is standing before our world, and we, like Pilate, have a choice. And so your decision will be as crucial for you as it was for Pilate. It will be whether you will buckle because of your need for acceptance from the secular world, or you will choose faithfulness to God as the guiding spirit of your life. Here we are today gathered together in this church, but there may come a day when you will face ridicule because of your membership with Christ — *because you are one with Christ.*

Before you as before Pilate Christ says, "I bear witness to the truth and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice." We are asked—no, we are commanded — to be steadfast in faith for Christ also said, "Take courage, I have overcome the world."

Think about your response. It could mean the difference between salvation or death.



RENOVATION UPDATE — SJN PARISH CHURCH AND SCHOOL



In the spirit of Thanksgiving, we are delighted to share our gratefulness for you and the fruits of the projects with you. 2024 is the 60th anniversary of our St. John Neumann Parish and we couldn't be more excited about our future!

It has been quite some time since we sought your input via our Planning/Feasibility Study to consider a renovation to the church and an expansion of our school. We received so much information. Your thoughts and ideas ranged from one end of the spectrum to the other! However, this inspired us to go back to the drawing board and reimagine these projects from different vantage points. We are excited with the fruits of this effort. Additionally, other factors such as township codes, budget realities, and space limitations needed to be taken into consideration. These considerations caused us to be more reflective of both the church and school situations and to be more intentional with the plans for both.

To respond to the challenges and opportunities before us, we made several changes to the professional assistants we are working with. We scrubbed many, many options to solve for the best solutions. This has taken time. However, we are very excited about the plans that have emerged! Key needs for both projects have been addressed while managing within the constraints presented.

We plan to share the plans as soon as we turn the corner on the new year — both are currently being refined. As such, we are not quite ready to start the campaign; we are not yet asking for gifts. Nonetheless, in this time of thanksgiving, we wanted to share the good news that both projects are progressing well and we are very excited to share more detailed plans in January.

Thank you for your patience and support while we took time to more fully assess your inputs, develop achievable concepts, and tug & pull at them to maximize solutions that will advance and inspire Christ's work in our Parish —our church and school— for the next 60 years!
