A man in his early 50's is alone in church. He's kneeling down, his head bowed down on the pew. He's totally disgusted with himself. He has a hard time now looking at himself in the mirror.

How could he be so stupid? Everything he stood for, everything he said he believed in was a lie! He was ashamed of himself. He was nothing but a hypocrite!

And now he would have to live with the truth about himself. Other people had done what he had done. They all gave in to the temptation. But this man always thought of himself as not capable of such a deed. But in the end, he was all talk — for when the time came — all his great words went up in smoke.

And so, kneeling in that pew, he asks God to forgive him. But he knows that he must do something more — it has to be said out loud to someone. He knows he can't bury it. He sees for the first time what he's capable of doing. And he thinks: Is this really me?

So this man does what many Catholics have to do at some time in their lives, he makes the most embarrassing confession he's ever made.

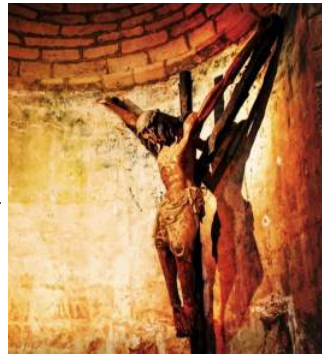
And here's what he hears the priest say in response: "That confession shows that you have a lot of character. You admit your wrong doing. Many try to hide it, but you were able to say it out

loud. You admitted that it was your fault and you take responsibility. From now on the words "God forgives us" has new meaning for you. Christ says to you: "This is why I came. That sin no longer stands in the way of you and I being friends. The punishment due to sin, I will take that; you, my son, are forgiven."

So, a wonderful healing experience for the man in the story. Many of us have been in that situation at some time or other I would think. Fear is probably the most paralyzing part of the experience. But afterwards, you can certainly feel peace. You can realize that the past is past, and although you can't change the past, you can do something about the present.

And as humbling as this kind of experience can be, you will find yourself not being so hard with others because you know that there was a time when you needed mercy. You step away from being the judge of others and leave that in God's hands.

The feeling of being a hypocrite is taken away because you have been honest. We remember the words of Christ: I have come not for the self-righteous but for sinners. I have come to save you from yourself. We also know that the words of Christ on the cross were meant for us: Father forgive them for they do not know what they are doing.



HOLY THURSDAY, JESUS CELEBRATES THE LAST SUPPER, PRAYS IN THE GARDEN OF GETHSEMANE, AND IS ARRESTED

It is Holy Thursday. We commemorate the Last Supper. Jesus institutes the Eucharist and washes the feet of his apostles. Our Lord struggles with the very human fear of his coming Passion, sweating blood in his distress. The Apostles—who were supposed to watch with him and keep him company—are leaning against the twisted olive trunks, fast asleep. "Could you not watch one hour with me?" is all that Our Lord says to them—yet it is the question which resounds every moment in our souls. Will we watch with him?

At the end of Mass, the priest leaves the tabernacle empty. This traditional practice is known as the Stripping of the Altars. Tonight, parishes hold Eucharistic adoration to commemorate the Agony in the Garden. The silence, the prayer, the quiet altar where the Blessed Sacrament is reposed—they all signify that evening in Gethsemane.

Tonight, we are given the chance to adore Our Lord in the Eucharist before tomorrow's ordeal. We can thank him for redeeming us. We can console him with our prayers. We can "watch with him" in his darkest hour.

PROJECT INSIGHTS: [THE QUIET ROOM OPTION IN THE VESTIBULE AND NARTHEX](#)

Our background begins with the church design and ends with a solution to address a need requested by parishioners and school parents alike.

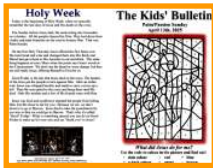
OUR CURRENT CHURCH LAYOUT DOES NOT OFFER AN APPROPRIATE VESTIBULE AND NARTHEX — The vestibule is a place apart from the body of the church and should dampen distractions from the world outside. The congregation first enters the vestibule and begins their journey away from the world and towards God's house. The narthex is considered a gathering space separate from the nave but within the church. **The new design creates important space in our church via a combined vestibule and narthex.**

THE REQUEST FOR A SPACE FOR QUIETING AND CALMING — Meanwhile, in a survey conducted in the spring of 2023, a highly rated need among all age groups, especially those 49 and younger, was the desire for an opportunity to be able to move to a space, if needed, for quieting and calming. We can imagine many times when such a space could be used. In most of these cases, the need for a quiet space is brief, needed suddenly and on-demand. *We desired that those in need of a space for quieting and calming remain part of the congregation. Our architects suggested using the new vestibule and narthex. This created the call for clear glass in all four doors moving into the nave, seating, a monitor, and sound. It also offers direct access to the restrooms and the Link. Importantly, those in the vestibule and narthex would remain part of the congregation, directly connected to Mass, yet with the opportunity to close the doors and have a space apart for a brief time. Of course, it is not required to use this space, but rather a convenient and accessible place to make use of, if desired.*

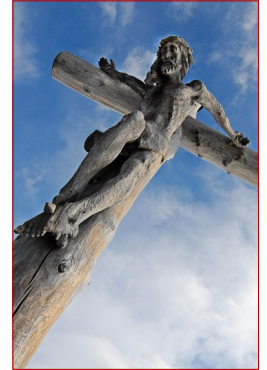

GOOD FRIDAY: JESUS IS SENTENCED TO DEATH, SCOURGED, BEATEN, CRUCIFIED, AND DIES ON THE CROSS

Formally known as the Good Friday of the Lord's Passion, recognizes the day of Christ's crucifixion — the most solemn day of the year for Christians. It is a day for us to turn our gaze to the cross and recognize Christ's most loving sacrifice for us. Good Friday is the day Jesus was tortured, mocked, crucified, and died. It was a day of incredible suffering and hatred. We call it *Good Friday* because the suffering and sacrifice of Jesus saved us from our sins. And even though it was an incredibly tragic day, it was one of the greatest days in history.

As it says in Isaiah, "He was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that made us whole, and with his stripes we are healed."

There is no path to happiness in this life unless you can make sense of suffering.
