In Memory of Bart
from the Bitterman Family



I would like to share with you a story that illustrates how suffering can be redemptive.

After the usual Sunday evening hymns, the church's pastor slowly stood up, walked over to the pulpit and, before he gave his sermon, briefly introduced a guest minister who was present that evening. The pastor told the congregation that the guest minister was one of his dearest childhood friends and that he wanted him to have a few moments to greet the congregation and share what he felt would be appropriate for the service.

With that, an elderly man stepped up to the pulpit and began to speak. "Once upon a time, a father, his son, and a friend of his son were sailing off the Pacific coast", he began, "when a fast-approaching storm blocked any attempt to get back to the shore. The waves were so high that even though the father was an experienced sailor, he could not keep the boat upright and the three were swept into the ocean as the boat capsized."

The old minister hesitated for a moment, making eye-contact with two teenagers who were, for the first time since the service began, looking somewhat interested in his story. The minister continued, "Grabbing a rescue line, the father had to make the most excruciating decision of his life: to which boy he would throw the other end of the life line?"

"He only had seconds to make the decision. The father knew that his son was a believer in Jesus, a good Christian, and he also knew that his son's friend was not and was living a sinful life. The agony of his decision could not be matched by the torrent of waves. Finally, as the father yelled out, 'I love you, son!' he threw out the lifeline to his son's friend. By the time the father had pulled the friend back to the capsized boat, his son had disappeared beneath the raging swells into the black of night. His body was never recovered."



By this time, the two teenagers were sitting straight in the pew, anxiously waiting for the next words to come out of the old minister's mouth. "The father", he continued, "knew his son would step into eternity with Jesus but he could not bear the thought of his son's friend stepping into an eternity without Jesus. Therefore, he sacrificed his son to save the son's friend."

He then paused and said with fervor, "How great is the love of God that he should do the same for us. Our Heavenly Father sacrificed his only begotten son that we could be saved. I urge you to accept his offer to rescue you and take a hold of the lifeline he is throwing out to you in this service."

With that the old man turned and sat back down in his chair as silence filled the room. Well, within minutes after the service ended, the two teenagers were at the old man's side. "That was a nice story," politely stated one of the boys, "but I don't think it was very realistic for a father to give up his only son's life in hopes that the other boy would become a Christian."

"Well, you've got a point there," the old man replied, glancing down at his worn Bible. As a soft smile broadened his narrow face, he once again looked up at the boys and said, "It sure isn't very realistic, is it? But I'm standing here to tell you that that story gives me a glimpse of what it must have been like for God to give up his Son for me. You see, I was that father and your pastor over there...he is my son's friend."

On Corpus Christi Sunday, we remember what Christ accomplished for us by his terrible death on the cross.

The Father sacrificed his Son to save us. Christ throws out a lifeline to us (most especially in the Sacrament of his Body and Blood). Grasp hold of that lifeline and allow Christ to give meaning to your life and even to your suffering. Realize that when you suffer you become stronger a person. You are able to persevere and be steadfast because you are holding on to Christ to died so that you might live.

July, Month of the Precious Blood

The month of July is dedicated to the Precious Blood. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.



"The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Savior shed for us on Calvary and re-assumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."

July 1: St. Junípero Serra, Priest (1713-1784)



José Miguel Serra was born the son of a farmer in Spain in 1713. When he was 17, he joined the Franciscans and took the name Junípero. As a priest, he taught philosophy and theology. Then he requested to be a missionary.

In 1749, he sailed for Mexico. After landing in Mexico, Junípero and another friar walked 300 miles to Mexico City. On the way, Junípero was bitten on the leg by a poisonous insect. This leg caused him pain for the rest of his life. At the shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Junípero dedicated his work to her.

In 1767, Junípero was made president of the 14 missions begun by Jesuits in Lower California. Then, when Spaniards took over Upper California in 1769, Junípero went with them. At age 56 and with his leg and foot swollen, he traveled the 900 miles on mule to San Diego, where he founded a mission. Junípero established 9 of the 21 Franciscan missions along the Pacific Coast and baptized a total of about six thousand Native Americans.

The missions were communities in which everything was held in common. The Native Americans were taught to grow crops and raise livestock. They learned to read, to sing, and to paint. They learned about the faith and asked to become Catholics.

Junípero once made the long trip back to Mexico City to meet with the military commander and establish rules to protect the Native Americans and the missions. Another time when an uprising left a Franciscan and several others dead, Junípero pleaded that the Native Americans held for the killings be released.

When Junípero was dying, he insisted on walking to the chapel for Holy Communion. He died on August 28, 1784. At his funeral, the weeping drowned out the singing. Junípero is called the father of California. Loyolapress.org
