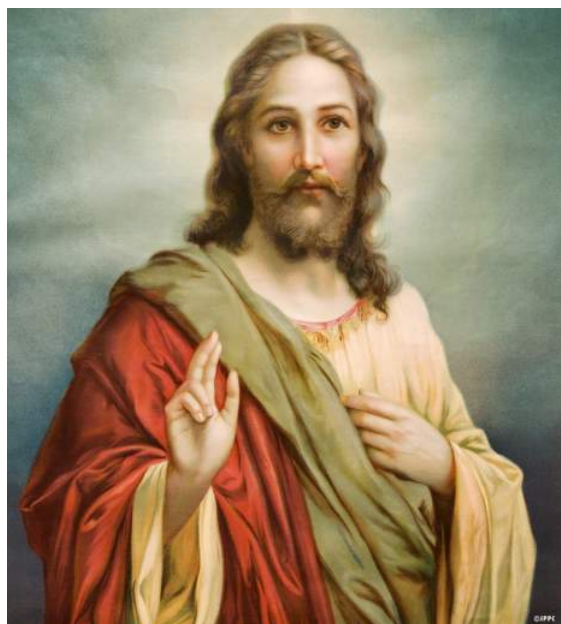

A priest in his mid-70's was sharing with a friend of his that he needed to have surgery for his right foot. He had been having difficulty walking uphill and long distances and this was starting to interfere with his work as the Pastor of a small parish in the city. This surgery was going to improve his situation.

His friend, who was also a classmate of his, said to him that he thought his friend would have to be patient about his recovery. He had to realize that maybe things were going to come around slowly, and that the procedure might not be completely successful. And the priest looked at this friend and said, "You don't seem to have much confidence in God! God is all powerful and *I'm counting on God to come through for me. Remember, nothing is impossible for God.*"

How much confidence do we have in God? When we pray, do we think that God will really *do* something for us—that God even hears our prayers? Or, is our prayer more a desperate measure, a long-shot, where we're not really expecting a response?

We hear these words from Jesus: "And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." *We are encouraged to have confidence in God. To know that God keeps his promises; that God wants to be involved in our lives; and most important of all, that God loves us.* Prayer is not an "exact science" where we take a course, learn how to do it, and then move on to something else. Prayer is more about having a relationship with God the Father through his Son, Jesus

Christ. Prayer becomes an expression of our deepest needs and longings. Prayer is not about trying to impress God with our holy words as much as it is about being open to receive God's gifts. So, we have to remind ourselves to stop relying on our human way of looking at life's situations, and beginning to see things in a new way—the way that God would want us to see them and respond to them.

A great spiritual writer, Sr. Ruth Burrows, a Carmelite Nun, in her book, *The Essence of Prayer*, puts it this way:

"The fundamental stance a Christian must take is that of receiving Him (God). First and foremost, *we must accept to be loved, allow God to love us, let God be the doer, the giver, let God be God to us.* But how hard it is for us to do that all the time. We are always reversing the role, intent on serving God—offering God something. Over and over again, Jesus tries to get his disciples to drop the self-important attitude and to understand that, before God, they are only very small children who have no resources within themselves, but must look to their parents for everything, simply everything."

This is what we are asked to think about today. Have confidence in God. Expect *more* from Him, and persevere in your prayer—like Abraham, keep asking. Be dependent on God for everything. "Ask and you *will* receive".

Aug. 4: St. John Vianney, Priest (1786-1859)

In 1805, John Vianney entered a seminary at age 19. After several months of study, he was still not prepared to attend lectures in Latin. He went to live with a friend who was a priest and who tutored him. This priest persuaded the bishop to ordain John not for his learning but for his holiness. After a few years, John was assigned to Ars, a village of about 50 families in France.

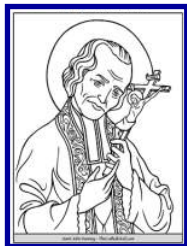
The people were careless about practicing their faith, so they were not happy with this priest who was eager to draw them back to God and Christian living. Some caused trouble by lying about John, by acting violently against him, and by refusing to cooperate with him. They hoped that he would give up and leave. Instead, Father Vianney increased his prayers, fasting, and penances. Gradually, people came to celebrate the sacraments and listen to his homilies. Within a few years, Father Vianney was spending 10-15 hours a day in the confessional. People from all over France and

other countries came to consult him. The government built a railroad line to Ars to accommodate all the pilgrims. Father Vianney just continued his hard, yet simple, way of prayer, fasting, and penance. He was strict with his parishioners but a hundred times more strict with himself. John gave away his furnishings, his belongings, and the gifts of clothes and food that the neighbors brought him. Once he received a black velvet cape as an award and sold it to buy food for those who were poor. He died at age 73. John was canonized in 1925 and is the patron of parish priests.

Aug. 6: The Transfiguration of the Lord

All three Synoptic Gospels tell the story of the Transfiguration (Matthew 17:1-8; Mark 9:2-9; Luke 9:28-36). With remarkable agreement, all three place the event shortly after Peter's confession of faith that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' first prediction of his passion and death. Peter's eagerness to erect tents or booths on the spot suggests it occurred during the week-long Jewish Feast of Booths in the fall.



According to Scripture scholars, in spite of the texts' agreement it is difficult to reconstruct the disciples' experience, because the Gospels draw heavily on Old Testament descriptions of the Sinai encounter with God, and prophetic visions of the Son of Man. Certainly Peter, James, and John had a glimpse of Jesus' divinity strong enough to strike fear into their hearts. Such an experience defies description, so they drew on familiar religious language to describe it. And certainly Jesus warned them that his glory and his suffering were to be inextricably connected—a theme John highlights throughout his Gospel. Tradition names Mount Tabor as the site of the revelation. A church first raised there in the fourth century was dedicated on August 6. A feast in honor of the Transfiguration was celebrated in the Eastern Church from about that time. Western observance began in some localities about the eighth century.

On July 22, 1456, Crusaders defeated the Turks at Belgrade. News of the victory reached Rome on August 6, and Pope Callistus III placed the feast on the Roman calendar the following year. franciscanmedia.org
