The parable of the tax collector and the Pharisee is a very challenging one. In praying with this parable we

are asked to see a very basic spiritual principle: *The ego is meant to revolve around God, not God around the ego.* Of course when we mention the word “ego” we are speaking of “I”—the self.

So the important question here is this: *Is God revolving around me or am I revolving around God.* If God is revolving around me then, my projects, plans, desires come first. God becomes “useful” to me. He’s the one who can make things happen. And, of course, when things go wrong, then I have every right to get mad at God and say things like: “You’re supposed to be helping me with my ‘ego project!’”. How many of us would fall into this category? How many of us see our relationship with God in this way?

Obviously this is not the right way of seeing our connection to God. Remember, the right dynamic is: The ego revolves around God—God becomes the center of gravity. If this is the case, then I (including my projects and plans, etc) revolve around God. Therefore the question is NOT: Is everything going according to my plan? The question is: Is my life going according to GOD’S plan? DO you see the difference?

We can very easily be drawn into the wrong kind of relationship.

In the parable that Jesus tells, we see the over confidence of the Pharisee. He is spending a lot of his prayer time patting himself on the back

and complimenting himself on what a great job he’s doing—certainly much better than that tax collector over there, or so he thinks! Yet when we look at this over confident Pharisee a question arises: *When was the last time you felt unworthy?* Time in prayer is really a time where we leave ego behind. Prayer is going up to God rather than turning in on self or feeding the ego. Do we ever feel a sense of unworthiness before the Lord—a sense of humility?

The tax collector, although a sinner, has a different perspective on his prayer. He has realized that he’s not where he’s supposed to be in his life, that things are moving in the wrong direction. And so he is saying: “Lord, have mercy”. Actually this tax collector, in his acknowledgement of his need for help and forgiveness, is in right relationship with the Lord. He is a sinner, but on the road to getting his relationship with God in right order. There is a difference between the attitude of the Pharisee and the attitude of the tax collector.



So, as we meditate on this very important parable, we want to make sure that we are in right relationship with the Lord. The Pharisee was in wrong relationship; the tax collector was in right relationship.

In closing let me leave you with the very beautiful prayer—sometimes called the “Jesus Prayer”. We should say this prayer over and over again throughout the course of the day to help us be in right relationship with the Lord: *Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me a sinner.*

Nov. 3: St. Martín de Porres , Religious (1579-1639)

Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru, to parents of mixed race. Raised primarily by his mother, a freed slave, Martin experienced the effects of racism and poverty early in his life. He became the apprentice of a barber, learning not only how to cut hair, but to perform basic medical treatments. Feeling called to give his life to God in service of the lowly, Martin entered the Dominicans, who accepted him as a lay helper and later as a brother. He spent his days caring for those who were sick and poor, as well as performing menial tasks within the monastery. His nights were spent in prayer, penance, and adoration. Martin treated everyone with respect and dignity, regardless of their race or social status. He was instrumental in founding an orphanage to care for Lima's many street children.



At his canonization ceremony in 1962, Pope John XXIII said of Saint Martin: "He tried with all his might to redeem the guilty; lovingly he comforted the sick; he provided food, clothing and medicine for the poor; he helped, as best he could, farm laborers and Negroes, as well as mulattoes, who were looked upon at that time as akin to slaves: thus he deserved to be called by the name the people gave him: 'Martin of Charity.'"

Saint Martin experienced the exclusion, derision, and discrimination of racism. Instead of growing bitter, he used his experience to reach out and comfort others. Martin's unwavering love of God and devotion to the Passion sustained him in his charitable works that often went unacknowledged.

At the moment of conception our human DNA, our own personal blueprint, is put in place. We are a new person, already inscribed with our physical traits, our intellect, and our personality!

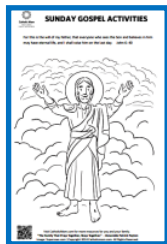
Though we start as a one-cell human, we quickly begin adding bulk and developing form: one cell becomes two, two become four... and very soon we start looking more familiar.

St. Charles Borromeo: The Good Shepherd



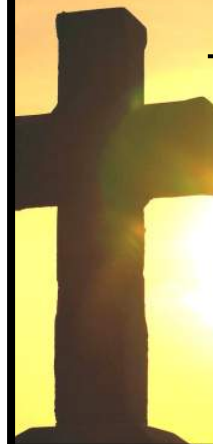

Nov. 4: St. Charles Borromeo, Bishop (1538-1584)



Patron Saint of Bishops, Catechists and Seminarians.

St. Charles Borromeo was an Italian bishop and reformer in the 16th century. Even though he was born into a wealthy family, Charles dedicated his life to serving the Church. Shortly after his ordination, he became Archbishop of Milan in 1564. To combat the corruption and ignorance that had influenced the Protestant Reformation, Charles established many seminaries, training programs, and communities for parish priests. He enforced decrees from the Council of Trent about sacred worship and abolished the selling of indulgences. He died from a fever in 1584. "Be sure that you first preach by the way you live." —St. Charles Borromeo
