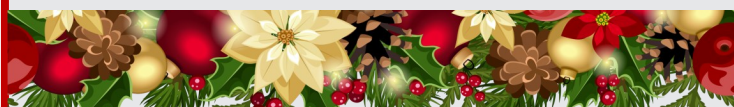

Our Parish book club read the novel "Silence" a few months ago. It's about Jesuit missionaries in Japan

in the Seventeenth century. These men braved many obstacles just to get to the far island of Japan, only to have to live in hiding among small Catholic communities in caves and on remote mountains. The leaders of Japan were very hostile to these men and when they found them, would subject them to horrible tortures. This was also the subject of a Martin Scorsese film which came out a few years ago.

As I began reading, I thought, "Would I have faith that strong to want to go to a distant land and face all that difficulty?" Did these Jesuits question themselves once they got there and faced the possibility of arrest, prison or worse?

John the Baptist, when he asks the question, "Are you the one who is to come or should we look for another?", is asking this question from prison. Was John wondering for a moment if he had made a mistake with his life? Was he thinking, "Did I back the wrong guy? Is this the end of the road for me?" As it turns out, he would never walk out of that prison alive. How did he react the night that the executioners appeared at the door of his cell?

John the Baptist had great faith, and he trusted in God's grace. Those Jesuits had great

faith. How about you? How strong is your faith? Although we may not have to go to prison for our faith, what we believe certainly is being challenged in our time.

In order to have faith we have to have confidence that God means what he says and keeps the promises that he made. And one of those promises concerns the forgiveness of our sins. Is our desire to follow Christ strong enough to let us see the need to have our sins forgiven, or do we think that sacrament is for the other guy, not me?

Sometimes our sins can create a kind of "prison" for us. Or we may look at ourselves in the mirror and think, "what a mess I've made of things." When we experience those moments, perhaps Christ is tapping us on the shoulder and whispering to us that he has a way out---a release for us. Making us aware of this is one of the reasons why it is important to experience the season of Advent.

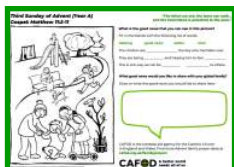

THE NICENE CREED



I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, *and rose again on the third day* in accordance with the Scriptures.

He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Third Week of Advent: Joy

The Third Week of Advent begins with Gaudete (Joyful) Sunday, and this week is focused on the joy of the Christian life. Since Advent is a penitential season, akin to a "mini" Lent, the Church celebrates a day of joy and hope as we draw closer to the end of Advent and the arrival of Christmas, the Nativity of Our Lord. The most noticeable shift in liturgy on Gaudete Sunday is the use of rose-colored vestments, which are only used on a handful of feast days or Solemnities. Gaudete Sunday celebrates the joy we as Christians feel as we contemplate the hope of the Savior with the gift of Christ's Incarnation. The first two weeks of Advent centered on hope and love must be seen and understood in order to realize the full depth of the third week of Advent and Gaudete Sunday. 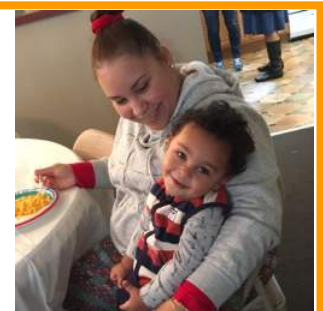
Ongoing Support

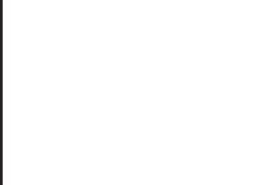

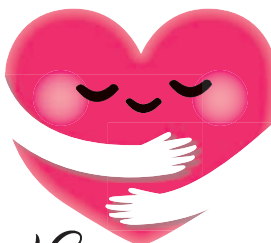
