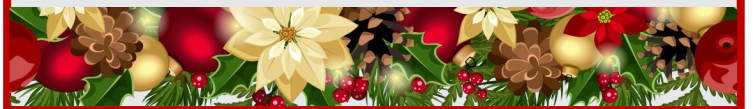

Joe wasn't sleeping well lately. Ever since he was told the other day that he was going to be laid off after

the first of the year, he spent his nights tossing and turning and not getting much sleep. What was he going to do? He'd just gone through this three years ago. It wasn't fair---and to find this out right before Christmas made it worse. Joe really wasn't up for beginning the job search again. And in the meantime the family would have to rely on his wife's salary, which wasn't that much. This was not the way he thought the year was going to end up. And he had to admit, it was really hard not to fall into despair.

So here we have St Joseph. I have the feeling that he had some sleepless nights before the angel appeared to him and told him to calm down---that God was taking care of things---that he would receive the grace to "hang in there"---to persevere.

And who's to say that St Joseph just automatically accepted as real what he had experienced in the dream? Yet it seems that he didn't give in to the feelings of doubt that he might have had in the beginning. And he didn't make a hasty decision regarding Mary. As things unfolded more and more in his life, St Joseph began to have more confidence in what God was doing and the role that Joseph had in God's plan of salvation.

When your world is turned upside down, how do you react? Do you get angry with God and walk away from your faith? Or do you rely on God so that you can persevere?

Many people say they believe in God and that he will help them, but once life falls apart or goes into the unexpected, they soon lose faith. It's kind of a black and white way of thinking: if you are good, nothing bad will happen to you. And if you sin than bad things will happen to you. If you're good and bad things happen anyway--- then you walk away from God.

Some people leave the church when they experience suffering, and others allow these kind of experiences to help them grow in their faith--- and they soon see that it is their faith that sees them through and holds them together. They realize that everyone has to experience suffering. When they look at Christ on the cross they realize that here was a good person who didn't deserve what *he* went through.

As we mature on the spiritual journey, we realize that we aren't just good to keep suffering away. We follow the commandments because we come to know that doing this transforms us. We know that when suffering enters our life it's not the end of the story. Joseph learned this and so did Mary. What does God say? Fear is useless. What is needed is trust.

Joseph and Mary didn't let their fears get the better of them for "perfect love casts out fear". They were more concerned about God's

dreams for them and others than they were about their own dreams for themselves.

What is God's dream for you?

Dec. 27: St. John, Apostle and Evangelist

St. John the Apostle was considered to be the youngest of the 12 Apostles. John, along with Peter and James, was part of the triumvirate of Apostles present at many key events, including the Transfiguration and the Agony in the Garden. The "disciple whom Jesus loved" referenced in the Gospel of John is frequently believed to be John. John the Apostle was made the guardian of Mary while standing at the foot of the Cross. He is a patron saint of love, loyalty, friendships, and authors, and is often depicted with an eagle. Book Club: Jesus and the Dead Sea Scrolls by John Bergsma

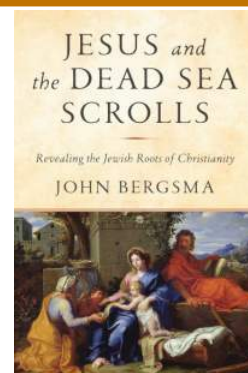

Dec. 26: St. Stephen

St. Stephen was the first Christian martyr, stoned to death two years after the Crucifixion of Jesus. St. Stephen was first mentioned in the Acts of the Apostles as one of the Seven Deacons appointed by the Apostles to serve the poor throughout the early Church. Just like the Lord, he died forgiving his executioners. He was stoned for being Christian and for his public preaching of Christianity even though he knew the great risk of practicing his faith. 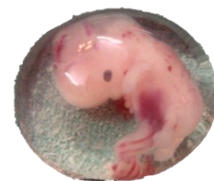


It's still the first trimester and our Spiritual Baby is developing

Week 9: There is rapid development of the limbs and fingers, and the soft bony tissues of the upper limbs begin to calcify and harden. The developing ears and nose are visible and there is pigment in the retina.

Week 10: The upper and lower portions of the arms and legs are clearly seen. The bony tissues of the lower limbs begin to calcify. The fingers and toes are lengthening and there are separate digits; they purposefully move. By the end of the week, baby has very distinct human features and weighs about 1/3 of an ounce. There are 20 tiny tooth buds present in the gums. The eyelids are developing and begin to close.

Week 11: Baby has all of the major organ systems. He/she is no longer called an embryo but rather a fetus (Latin for 'young one' or 'offspring'). Baby is about 2" long. During the next several weeks, baby's body will grow rapidly and the tissues and organ systems will continue to mature and differentiate. The eyelids are fully formed and are now closed to protect the developing eyes. Baby can yawn and suck.
