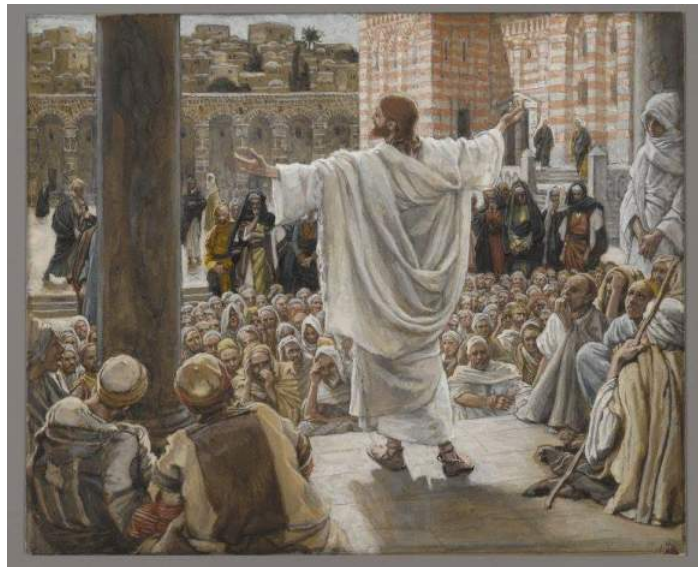

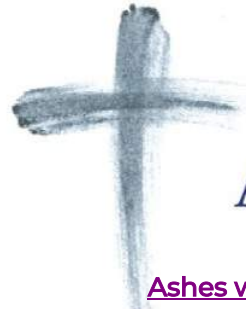

Ashes will be distributed at:

- ◆ 6:45 AM Mass
- ◆ 8:00 AM Mass
- ◆ 12:00 PM Prayer Service
- ◆ 7:00 PM Mass

Fasting & Abstinence

- ◆ **Abstinence:** All persons 14 years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
 - ◆ **Fasting:** All persons 18 years of age and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.
- ◇ If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.



Each Lent, Catholic families across the country unite to put their faith into action through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Through CRS Rice Bowl, families learn about how our sisters and brothers across the globe overcome hardships like hunger and malnutrition, and how through Lenten alms, we have the power to make the world a better place for all.

Tom had to admit, he was becoming a cynical person. He seemed to be filled with fear all the time and was often distracted and becoming distant with his family and friends.

This negative attitude started to take root in him when things at work seemed to become more complicated and harder to manage. When he first started his job things would go smoothly, and if there were problems, they were quickly and fairly resolved. But with the change in leadership at the very top of the organization, things started to change. Now “process” became everything and the people involved in those processes seemed not to matter. Nor did the amount of work thrown on staff matter. Nothing was ever taken away, things were just added.

It also looked to Tom that decisions were being made all for the wrong reasons. In general, he thought the leaders of the organization were losing the transparency that had originally attracted him to want to work for this company. And Tom had to admit, he wasn't getting the affirmation he had been getting under the previous leadership. So this made him second guess himself all the time and he started losing confidence in himself.

People began to see a change in Tom. All of this was having an effect on his personality. His wife and children of course noticed it first, but his closest friends saw something was wrong as well. Tom wasn't himself and the vibe he was sending to those around him was not all that positive. Tom was seeing these changes in himself and couldn't deny any of this. He needed to really take a long hard look at the general direction of his life. He realized he needed to regroup and reclaim the person he was supposed to be—the person God wanted him to be.

Jesus says to his disciples: “You are the salt of the earth...You are the light of the world.” He's not talking about himself, he's telling his followers—and that includes us—what we should be for others. Sometimes things can happen in our own lives that begin to interfere with the effect that we can have on others, especially those closest to us. If we lose who we are we can't be salt and light for others.

And what does it mean to be salt, to be light? In saying that his disciples are “salt of the earth”, Christ is describing the critical character of the Christian vocation. *Either* the Christian heightens the quality of human life and makes it more palatable, more delightfully nourishing, or he has no reason for being. “Salt is not for itself, cannot be its own end; it serves a humble yet somehow indispensable purpose. Insipid Christians, those who have lost their proper flavor, have forgotten their function as a condiment of society... No doubt they let this happen by blending into the common environment, out of exhaustion, perhaps, or for some other reason... fear maybe...”

Same for the light. Christ is telling us, ‘and by your presence others shall see better.’ Salt and light each impart their own virtue, provided they remain fully what they are.

Keep your gaze on Christ, not on your problems. Trust and don't be fearful.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.



During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Ash Wednesday: Why do we put ashes on our heads every year?

The people of Nineveh performed penance in sackcloth and ashes after Jonah delivered God's message to them. Job scattered ash on his food when everything he possessed was taken from him.

The early Church adopted the Jewish custom of ash as an external symbol of penance or grief:

In the Old Law ashes were generally a symbolic expression of grief, mourning, or repentance.

In the Early Church the use of ashes had a like signification and with sackcloth formed part of the public penances. —The Roman Catholic Daily Missal, 1962

So, why ash?

Ash represents our mortality; just as ashes are the remains of wood consumed by fire, so our bodies will be reduced to dust after we die. We recall our mortality to practice humility, reminding ourselves of our extreme lowliness and the brevity of earthly life.

Traditionally, the forty days of Lent represent Our Lord's forty-day fast in the desert. For us, the forty days mark a period of penance and prayer as we accompany Our Lord on the road leading to His Passion. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and the cross of ash upon our foreheads is to remind us that we ought to repent of our sins, especially during the Lenten season.

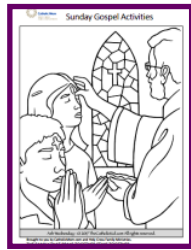
